BLOCKWATCH UPDATES

The March meeting of the Forest Park Block Watch was held on the 22nd at Epworth Methodist Church, with 27 residents attending. Sgt. Ketcham of the Columbus Police Dept's Community Response Team was our featured speaker. The Community Response team (CRT) is made up of 3 units in Columbus (10 officers and a sergeant working 2 pm-midnight, Wed-Sat). Seasoned officers (the youngest officer on Sgt. Ketcham's team has 10.5 years experience) wanted and won these positions when they were posted. Their focus is on the problems that we report. The city received a 4 year grant to create this kind of team, which is in it's second year. Sgt. Ketcham, who has 16.5 years of experience in the inner city, led the 2007-2008 Mayor's initiative for gun violence in South Linden. Many officers from those teams are involved in the CRT today. The team is meant to respond to community concerns. In order to work a complaint, the CRT is required to tie the issue back to a specific concern. Most recently, heroin trafficking has rated high. Sgt. Ketcham gave a recent example where their experience in inner city crime allowed them to resolve one such problem. Code enforcement got involved in boarding up the house that was involved. The people involved were arrested.

If you have a police issue you would like investigated (non-emergency) you can contact the Forest Park Block Watch or CRT. To contact the CRT, call the phone number of the substation where they are based (614-645-4942) and ask for the CRT. Sgt. Ketcham's email address is rketcham@columbuspolice.org. Block Watch members should identify themselves as involved in Block Watch. The CRT creates "projects" as they get information from citizens. They will prioritize these as they may have up to 10 projects going on at one time, but will refer projects to other divisions as necessary, i.e., narcotics bureau for trafficking.

If it's not a police matter, they will refer you to the right department. They are given a large area to cover, so they prioritize the work. Parking complaints are going to be rated lower than gang violence. We need to be specific on what we see and the times/activities/people involved. If you have an ongoing problem, GET A NOTEBOOK and write down what you see: time, date, and details, details, details. Information that really helps: personal description(s), residence location, cars they drive (with plates), cars that frequent the residence, and times you notice odd activity. Remember, you might have a problem house, but a law has to be broken to before the police can get involved. That's what that CRT does first: they observe and take notes. If you do have a problem house, get your neighbors involved. Many people may not want to be directly involved, but might be willing to track details and get them to you so you can pass the information on to the police/CRT. Remember, though, that the police are not code enforcement and are not the zoning board! If you see a crime in progress, call 911: that's when arrests get made. Otherwise call the non-emergency police number at 645-4545. It is important to call in **all** crimes. They want to hear what our issues are, even when it's illegal parking. For example, they received reports from the Tuttle area on parking problems, so they sent a team out and wrote 12 tickets and towed 4 cars. At the end of the meeting, Dave Paul bestowed a pin for Sgt. Ketcham for appreciation of the service performed in our neighborhood.

Other concerns were also discussed with Sgt. Ketcham and Officer Clinger, our Community Liaison Officer. We should report non-working street lights to the city. We've had 40-50 lights get fixed in a few days once we had people called them in. The narcotics/trafficking going on in the 71/161 area was discussed: several significant search warrants/busts have occurred in the last few months. We have recently had a case where a house has been posted as "must be vacant" (i.e. due to arson): if the owner enters the posted house, this is a crime. It should be reported, and the person can be arrested. There also has been a concern with panhandlers in local parking lots saying they are homeless and wanting money, sometimes with a child. Call the non-emergency police number at 645-4545. Also, let the business owner know. Some have supplemental security. The minutes from our last meeting were approved.

The Vice President of NCC challenged each civic association to give the parade \$50. There will be a contest for the best civic association. The deadline for submission is May 8.

The Forester deadline is April 14.

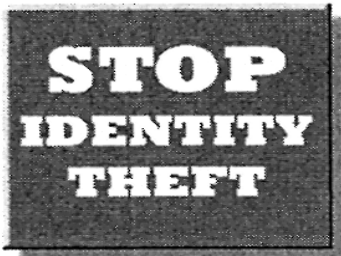
