

What makes a collection of buildings into a community? What turns a house into a home? The people who live there. We have a won-

derfully diverse group of people in Forest Park, who have turned this collection of houses into one of the best communities in Columbus. There are about 2800 homes in Forest Park. We have residents who have lived here since the community was built in 1961. We have residents who have just moved in. We have new families and old families, seniors and kids. I have a neighbor from Peru, and our Supplemental Security Chair is from Ghana. We have a wonderful kalidioscope of people in this place we call home. I encourage you to get out and meet at least one new neighbor this month as the weather warms and we begin to work on our yards, plant our gardens, and mow our lawns. Come out to Forest Park Night at Gabby's on June 7. Watch or march in the Northland Fourth of July Parade. Have a driveway cookout for National Night Out in August. And, lest I forget, join the Civic Association.

While the people of Forest Park make up the body of our community, I like to think that the Civic Association is it's backbone. We support the community. We advocate for the residents in city government and with city officials. We help to beautify the community and keep it safe. And we have had some successes this year. The Red

Carpet Inn was closed earlier this spring as a nuisance. Some Forest Park residents testified on behalf of this and worked with the police and city officials. Good use was made of the city's 311 system, which resulted in rapid repair of potholes during the spring campaign. We were able to help some residents with code concerns. And the burned out house on Boxwood was finally torn down!



was mostly due to the dedicated efforts of residents who lived on that street, we were able to amplify that voice and make it heard. We've had failures too, to be sure. We were not able to see the changes of traffic lanes on Tamarack Circle reversed, as the residents wanted. But the city does hear our voice. Forest Park residents have been instrumental in working on the 161 Clean Up days, making the entry to our neighbor-

hood cleaner and prettier. Our Supplemental Security service--which appears to be unique in Columbus--helps keep our streets safer with an extra 5 hours of patrols each week. While there is still crime in Forest Park, the rates are lower than in adjacent areas. And I do not want to forget our Block Watch, open to all on the fourth Tuesday of the month, which while

independent of the Civic Association, also assists in keeping Forest Park safer. All we ask as a Civic Association is that you join us in these efforts.....Continued on page 3

We Move the Meter

Ohio State football is never boring. Some commentators make a living bashing the Buckeyes and provoking its fan base. ESPN has sued Ohio State over public records issues and yet wants to broadcast every game it can get. Why is that? Because Ohio State "Moves the Meter!" It has the largest alumni base in the country and people root hard for or against them. Large, passionate groups get attention.

As a Forest Park resident, you are part of the largest individual neighborhood in Columbus. Forest Park and the entire Northland Community also moves the meter. That is why if a crime happens on 5th Avenue, the local news teaser will label it a north side crime. We care in great numbers and therefore we move the meter.

Moving the meter provides huge opportunities for neighborhood enhancement. In our email and letter campaign to cleanup 1299 Boxwood, countless residents filed 311 reports or sent messages. All indications are that this process moved the meter and brought it to a much quicker conclusion. A larger, better connected group of FPCA members will move the meter further. Here are three actions you can do to help.

<u>Action #1</u> Please Get your Membership Sent Back to Us Soon. It's only \$25, but it funds supplemental security patrols and neighborhood advocacy. Also, consider including your email address so that we can add you to the electronic newslist. When you mail in your membership (or join via paypal through our website), you help the door-to-door campaign to expand FPCA's base. Your action is greatly appreciated.

<u>Action #2</u> Send a Quick Email... You're probably aware of the April YMCA shooting incident. While details are few, we can suspect that it was drug related. Much of our neighborhood's illegal activity can be directly connected to several poorly ran hotels off of Dublin Granville Rd. As always, FPCA will continue to work with the police and Block Watch, send as many security patrols as our budget will allow, and provide community information.

That brings us back to the proposed "Chula Vista Hotel Ordinance" proposed by CPD Officer Scott Klinger this past fall. This proposed legislation would require hotels with questionable conduct to apply for annual licenses to operate. They would have to make the case for why they deserve to stay open (no longer the city's case for why they shouldn't). Last fall, it was an idea and now it will be debated. Klinger said our previous letters and phone calls to the city really helped in the progress (he joked that he got a slap on the wrist for providing us contact information). Let us re-express our desire for this legislation and further support our CPD.

Briefly ask for the passage of the Chula Vista Hotel Ordinance. Emphasize the importance this bill would have to your community. PLEASE be friendly and polite.

<u>Action #3</u> Register with the Forest Park Blockwatch... Add your eyes and ears to our community's protection. If you have not done so, go to www.fpcivic.org/bwforum to get access to the blockwatch fourm. Please get connected! Blockwatch meets the fourth Tuesday of every month 7:00 P.M. at Epworth UMC.

Finally, thank you to all of the supporters who diligently join, advocate and support. There are so many members who quietly support us without receiving fanfare of recognition. We greatly appreciate you, and value your sincere dedication to our community. **THANKS!!!**

Dick Buttermore Bikes and Trikes Parade



May 13, 2014 FPCA Meeting Minutes

The May FPCA meeting was called to order by President Ken Gilbert at Epworth United Methodist Church at 7:04 p.m. Roll Call was taken after the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer Dan Hartzell presented his financial report, which was accepted by the membership as read. Members discussed the demolition of 1299 Boxwood Drive. Questions regarding possible uses and ownership came up, and remain open.

Members discussed changes in billing for advertisements in the Forester and voted on implementing those changes from billing in arrears to in advance beginning July 1, 2014. Established accounts will be grandfathered in.

Dick Graham, a neighborhood liaison for the city, took notes regarding complaints of overgrown bushes, water leaks, the parking of commercial trucks on residential property, and high grass, and damaged traffic guides on Tamarack Circle.

Officer Clinger wants all Forest Park residents to be mindful of keeping garage doors closed when working in the yard, as valuable items can be stolen in just a minute or two. He took questions about the parking of commercial trucks on city residential streets, and reported that some unruly school truants had been effectively handled.

Due to the sporadic delivery of the Forester, Ed Vanasdale will look into alternate delivery systems, including fees and possible restrictions.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:04 p.m. by Ken Gilbert.




