

## Supplemental Security News By Felix Quachey

I am happy to report that except for a few incidents, we continue to have a relatively quiet summer with regard to criminal activity in our neighborhood. I believe that there are several contributory factors to this; however the top 3 reasons in my opinion are:

- 1. The closure of several of the hotels/motels around our neighborhood that served as a base for a lot of the criminal activity in our area.
- 2. The continued vigilance of Forest Park residents: this is the most important weapon in our arsenal in our fight to shield our neighborhood against undesirable criminal elements.
- The Supplemental Security Patrol: serves as an added security presence and is a great deterrent to crime in our neighborhood. I believe that their ability to keep an eye on vacant homes in our neighborhood, coupled with the vigilance of all our residents contributes to the overall safety and security of Forest Park!

I do have to mention the few incidents this past month that have occurred in our neighborhood that have been brought to my attention. First, someone walked into a resident's backyard and made off with their grill. On the same street, another neighbor had some wrought iron benches taken off their property, while another had yard furniture stolen.

The common thread in all three of these incidents is that the perpetrators are walking into our neighbors' yards, looking for these items and making off with them. Once again, I encourage you all to be sure to call the Columbus Police Department's Non-Emergency line at 614-645-4545 to file a police report or file your report online at www.columbuspolice.org. I can't say enough that no matter how small you think an incident is, please keep in mind that filing the police report if very important because it allows the police to gather enough data on the different types of crime going on in our area in an effort to identify patterns—is it a random act or a recurring trend in a particular area? This information allows them to delegate the appropriate resources to catching the perpetrators of these crimes. Once your police report is filed, you can pass on the police report number to me and I will bring it to the attention of our Neighborhood Liaison Office at the Columbus Police Department to pass it on to their Community Response Team who can take a closer look at it.

Lastly, if there are any vacant homes on your street, please give us a call with the address of the vacant property so we can make sure to have our security patrol keep an eye on them to stop them from become a site for criminal activity.

Remain vigilant and continue to send in your reports so we can leverage our community's partnership with the Columbus Police to keep our neighborhood safe.




