HONE FOR THE HOLDAYS By Ken Gilbert, FPCA President

There's a saying that home is where the heart is and I'm glad my heart is here in this community. I expect our celebrations will be as diverse as our community, and that's one of the things that make Forest Park great. Do be careful during this season, however. Unfortunately criminals take the opportunities presented during this time to do "shopping" of their own. Use caution when you mail packages or have packages sent to you. Many criminals will follow the delivery trucks around. Try to make sure you are home when packages are delivered or use an alternate address. You can ask the post office to hold packages for you, and some form of delivery confirmation is now free with most kinds of packages from most providers. Take care when discarding holiday boxes and recycling your trash--it can be very easy for the criminal to discover that you have a new big screen tv or other new big ticket item, simply by looking at the trash you leave out. There are recycling locations around the city where you can take such bulk items. Also, when shopping at the mall, avoid taking your purchases back to your car and then returning to the stores to continue shopping. Put them in the trunk and then move your car somewhere else in the lot--it only takes a minute and might save you from a break-in. And finally, be careful about fire safety. Many folks still use live trees and they are fine if handled correctly. Always have an extinguisher on hand and don't keep the lights on too long. We want all of our residents to enjoy a safe holiday season.

Finally, it's also time to take stock of 2014 and plan for the next year. We've had a solid year, but we still need your help to serve the community better. We'd love to have more volunteers in the association. "Many hands make light work", as the proverb goes. There are a number of opportunities to help out with the Welcome Committee and as an Area Representative. Make a resolution this year to get involved! I said in the November issue that we need 57 more members to join by the end of the year to keep our annual budget in check. Shortly after, we broke below the 50 mark and anticipated the gap to close at a quick pace. We ask you to please invest the \$25 to help fund the organization that is dedicated to helping your residential quality of life.

Remember, you can go to www.fpcivic.org and join via Paypal, you can mail in the enclosed membership form, or you can contact any board member to have your membership picked up (my personal number is 614 218-1788).

At the November FPCA meeting, there were discussions on how home sales are increasing and therefore reducing the number of Forest Park homes on market. This brings good news for all residents. It also brings a lot of new faces to the neighborhood that FPCA is welcoming, or trying to welcome. Tracking down and greeting new residents is likely the most challenging job FPCA does.

If you are new to Forest Park, you will be happy to know that your civic association works year-round to represent the neighborhood interests to the city. It calls attention to code and safety needs while working with FP Block watch and local police to deter criminal activity. FPCA's supplemental security program makes this neighborhood the only one in Columbus to have its own private security patrols. 60% of the FPCA budget is reserved for them. So the more memberships, the more security.

As member of FPCA, you are entitled to home vacation checks. If you are traveling out of town, you only need to contact our supplemental security officer, Felix Quachey. Provide him with the necessary information and a supplemental security officer will inspect your home for safe keeping. This includes a walk around your home to make sure everything is as you would want it to be. If there are any problems, you will be notified from your out of town location.

Whether your motivation is piece of mind or a desire to support the improvement of the neighborhood, we greatly appreciate your support in joining. Thank you!!

Supplemental Security News Submitted by Felix Quachey

As we enter into the holiday season, I would like to wish all Forest Park residents a very happy, blessed and safe 2014 Holiday Season. I also know that as you check off your holiday shopping lists and vacation plans, crooks will also be hard at work trying to pick of easy targets so I thought I would share some tips for your safety this holiday season.

- Do not have packages delivered to your home while you are at work. Arrange for them to be delivered to a neighbor or to your place of business.
- Be careful not to leave any of your holiday shopping lying visibly in your car in mall parking lots or in your driveway or garage. Lock your shopping bags or packages in your trunk while at the mall and when you get them home, do not leave the garage door open while you make trips into the house;
- 3. Do not broadcast your vacation itinerary on social media until you have returned

If you are shopping online keep the following in mind:

- 4. Change your passwords regularly
- Monitor your bank or credit cards statements closely and contact your financial institution when you come across charges you did not authorize immediately
- Use caution when responding to email offers: do not click on unsolicited links in emails, go directly to the website of the business identified and never respond to unsolicited emails.
- Be a savvy shopper: before you click "purchase" make sure the price includes all taxes and handling fees and know the return policy. Many online merchants may charge a restocking fee this time of year.

Lastly, I would like to ask that all residents who are planning to be away for vacations try to get their requests to have Supplemental Security keep an eye on their homes at least a week in advance of their trip. We have to ensure that with our limited resources and scheduling constraints, we are able to do a good job of securing your home your absence.



Representative-Elect David Leland's Visit

At our last Association meeting, newly elected State Representative David Leland (D 22nd) was invited to speak and get to know us. In our area, his district covers Forest Park West and part of Forest Park East. He spoke briefly about his plans for the next session. His main goals are working to implement in a bipartisan way the Medicare expansion introduced by Governor Kasich this year and better ways of drawing legislative districts. But his main reason in coming was to talk with us and listen to our concerns. Two issues came up. The first was the campaign to clean up the local hotels. It's an area state government can help with, as licensing is handled by the state, and we were able to put David in touch with folks who have been working on this issue in our area with some success. The other main issue we discussed dealt with keeping Forest Park's sub-urban nature intact while being part of a major city. He hopes residents will contact him with their concerns, ideas, and suggestions in the future, though he does not have an official office open yet. We'll publish that information, once we have it, in the next available issue of the Forester. He noted that he's gotten to know Forest Park pretty well, as he'd pretty much walked every street in the Park during his campaign, and he hopes that knowledge will help him represent us better.

<u>Cat Issues in the City of Columbus</u> from Columbus Veterinarian

I issue notice to residents that feed or harbor stray/feral cats which create a nuisance on other's properties, with the potential for subsequent mediation and/or court action if evidence is sufficient to show an individual as an owner, keeper, or harborer of the cats. In order to move forward, addresses of owners, keepers, har-

borers can be entered through 3-1-1 via phone or email under "Feeding or Harboring Stray or Feral Cats".



As far as organizations that offer services such as TNR or TNVR, these organizations are always at "full capacity". Programs such as these offer band-aids to the societal problem of irresponsible pet ownership, and will never get ahead of the growing problem of unwanted stray/feral cats. Additionally, organizations that take in adult cats for re-homing them, like Colony Cats, are burdened with the lop-sided competition with that cute, adorable kitten that is likely to be found in any municipal neighborhood nowadays as a result of the burgeoning population of intact stray/feral cats breeding, as well as the numerous insanitation complaints I received and investigated concerning facilities like Colony Cats.

In the past few years, I have conducted two public meetings regarding stray/feral cats, and realize the solution to this growing problem is through harmonizing the public mindset and governmental regulations through a unique winwin situation focusing on the kittens. However, like all large scale projects, it requires resources that currently are not available.

Crazy Cat Lady Corner <u>Homeless Cats in Forest Park</u>

<u>Question</u>: Do we have a cat problem in Forest Park? <u>Answer</u>: NO, we have a people problem. These animals have been abandoned by people. A feral cat is a domesticated cat that has returned to the wild, or the descendants of such an animal. It is distinguished from a stray cat, which is a pet cat that has been lost or abandoned, while feral cats have never been socialized. The offspring of a stray cat can be considered feral if born in the wild.

Question: Cats dig in my garden, what can I do? Answer: Some great suggestions from

www.alleycat.org are:

Scatter fresh orange and lemon peels or spray with citrus-scented fragrances. Coffee grounds, vine-

gar, pipe tobacco, or oil of lavender, lemongrass, citronella, or eucalyptus also deter cats.

Plant the herb rue to repel cats, or sprinkle dried rue over the garden.

- Use plastic carpet runners spike-side up, covered lightly in soil. They can be found at local hardware or office supply stores. Or, set chicken wire firmly into the dirt with sharp edges rolled under.
- Artfully arrange branches in a lattice-type pattern or wooden or plastic lattice fencing material over soil. You can disguise these by planting flowers and seeds in the openings. You can also try embedding wooden chopsticks, pinecones, or sticks with dull points deep into the soil with the tops exposed eight inches apart.

<u>Question:</u> How can I help? Answer: Recently feral cat neutering has been

stepped up in Forest Park by some animal lovers. *Trap-neuter-return* is the recommended approach for spay/neuter of homeless cats that are too timid or feral to be handled. Cats are humanely trapped, altered, eartipped (while under anesthesia, to signify that they are fixed), given a rabies shot, treated for parasites, and are returned to their territory after recovery for ongoing supervision by their caregiver. We don't want to admit it but yes, Winter Weather has already arrived even though the season has not officially started. New this year to the citizens of Columbus is website for us to view when streets including those in the residential neighborhoods will get plowed if that snowy white mix makes an appearance in our neighborhoods. "COLUMBUS WARRIOR WATCH" is the website to view where Snowplows have cleared snow in Columbus.

Here are some additional tips from Columbus' Department of Public Service about shoveling sidewalks and driveways:

* Shovel your sidewalk: Under City Code, property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice off sidewalks that abut their properties or are on their properties. This applies to both residences and businesses (City Code Section 902.03)

When shoveling your driveway, do not shovel or push snow into the street or onto a side-walk. City Code prohibits shoveling snow into the street or onto a sidewalk (City Code Section 902.03). Pile snow in a yard or another spot away from a sidewalk, driveway or steps.

* Apply salt, sand or cat litter to icy steps and paths

* Drive with extra care and leave additional distance between you and the vehicle in front of you

- * Maintain a distance of no less than 100 feet behind a snow plow truck
- * Avoid passing snow plow trucks because the drivers cannot always see a smaller car about to pass
- * Follow snow emergency laws when a snow emergency is declared
- * When possible, park vehicles in driveways or parking lots and off streets to give plow trucks room to plow
- * Check on senior citizens, shut-ins and other neighbors with mobility impairments
- When the snow begins to melt, clear snow from in front of catch basins by shoveling the snow into storm sewers. The heat of the storm sewer will melt the snow and allow other melting snow and ice to flow freely into storms sewers.

November 11, 2014 FPCA Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Ken Gilbert at Epworth United Methodist Church at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by the roll call.

The President relinquished his time to visitor David Leland, newly elected Ohio House of Representative. Rep-elect Leland announced intentions for his term, including finding ways that the Ohio House could help with local community matters. There was a question and answer period in which the Ohio Dept of Commerce was discussed and its role with hotel licensing and the impact on local communities in Ohio.

Treasurer Dan Hartzell presented the treasurer's report for October, which was accepted as read.


Discussion about bringing <u>The Forester</u> back to a financial breakeven point led to a 3 part motion by Mary Sguerra. She put forward that the distinction between news and ads should be drawn at the discretion of the editor, that fees for all future business ads be increased according to the following schedule: \$150 (full page), \$80 (half page), \$50 (quarter page) \$30 (business card size), and that all ads in <u>The Forester</u> will be taken on a prepaid basis only. This motion was seconded by Mike Stone and passed. There are plans for a special meeting called to discuss other ways to increase revenue and decrease costs for the Forester, to be determined at a later time.

There was a brief discussion of the 2015 budget, which was tabled until the next FPCA meeting.

Outgoing Chairman Earl Miller presented the Welcome Committee report, and later suggested that the committee be dissolved. If the committee is dissolved, area reps would assume welcoming duties. There will be further discussion of this issue, to be determined at a later time.


