Why I don't want to miss Forest Park Civic Association Meetings!

Many people think that our meetings are just for the volunteers in the community or the leaders of the association. However, in the past few years, we have tried to open our meetings to the general membership and to our community. All meetings except the December meeting are open meetings. While we do discuss the business of the association at our meetings, the bulk of our time is spent discussing many areas of interest or our community. Often they are issues that we would like to have the community's input on. In February, for example, we had a speaker from a local Free Clinic. In March, we had representatives from a local group dealing with the issue of feral cats, which was well attended. In April, I want to invite you all to come hear from and talk to City Council Member Shannon Hardin. He already has come to a recent meeting of the Northland Community Council--and he came to listen. Please come, bring a neighbor, and bring your questions and concerns about our community. It's a great chance to have the ear of a city leader. As always, we will hear from our local police liaison, Officer Scott Clinger, who is one of the folks responsible for the recent drop in crime in our area due to the closing of a number of problem hotels. We will also have a time to bring other city concerns, such as code issues to the attention of the city. Please send these to our Supplemental Security Officer, Felix Quachey, so we can address them, if possible, before the meeting. Having the number of your 311 request, as we discussed last month, helps to expedite these requests. Come join us at our next meeting, 7 pm at Epworth United Methodist Church on April 14th.

Don't forget the 161 Cleanup Day, coming up on April 11, and the Northland Community Shredding Day on May 16. More information on these may be found in this issue. I also want to thank the community for a great turnout at the Columbus Police's Community Meetings, one of which was held in our area on March 12. We represented Forest Park well, and a number of our residents had some great questions and suggestions.

Also, our annual membership drive will begin shortly with our membership mailing. For \$25 a year, you help to promote our community and, in a very real way, help to keep it safe, as a percentage of our dues go to a Supplemental Security patrol. We are the only community in Columbus, as far as we know, to offer such a program. This helps to keep Forest Park's already low crime rate to be even lower. We also plan to publish our Forest Park Neighborhood Directory this year. All members in good standing will receive a copy. Please consider joining us this year. Note: We now accept PayPal. 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FPCA Minutes — March 10, 2015

The meeting was called to order by President Ken Gilbert at 7:03 p.m. at Epworth United Methodist Church. After the Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call, the president gave his report.

He turned the floor over to guests Paula and Jay Matthew from Woodward Park. They spoke and answered many questions from concerned residents for approximately 30 minutes about feral cats in the area. They focus on trapping and neutering, then returning the cats to their territory.

Our community police liaison Scott Clinger had the floor for the next thirty minutes. He gave reports on the Karl Road Library issue of a person stealing cell phones. He also gave an update on hotels and businesses in the area. He commented that community input, information and support have been very helpful.

Treasurer Dan Hartzell presented his financial report for February. A motion to accept the report as read was put forward, and passed.

Committee reports were next. Security Chair Felix Quachey reported that the main problem in Forest Park continues to be theft and burglary, but has not seen any large increase in those issues. Outreach Chair Mike Stone announced that this year's membership drive will run from March 21st, where membership materials will be stuffed and prepared for mailing and ending with Outreach day on July 11th.

Ed Vanasdale reported that inquiries have been made regarding an update of the Forest Park Directory. He proposed a plan to finance most of the costs of publishing with advertising dollars. Ken Gilbert made a motion to accept the plan, seconded by Dave Paul. Motion was passed by voice vote. Mr. Paul cautioned we might need to halt the project if funding isn't adequate. Planned publication dates of last quarter of 2015 or first quarter of 2016 were mentioned.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:02 p.m. Submitted by Marie Douthitt

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Supplemental Security News

With spring hopefully around the corner, I wanted to take a moment to remind residents that with good weather comes a higher incidence of crime. I encourage you all not to get too intoxicated by the much anticipated warmer temperatures to the extent that you forget to secure your home. The following tips never get old:

Keep your garage doors closed at all times—especially when you are doing yard work and when you bring groceries home from the store.

Make sure to use the deadbolt on all your exterior doors even when you are at home.

Keep all ground floor windows locked

If you have vehicles parked outside, do not leave any valuables in plain sight.

Most importantly, as the weather gets better, get out and re-acquaint yourselves with your neighbors so **that the crooks stick out more clearly. If you don't know them, you are more likely to pay attention to them walking on your street.**

Lastly, please remember to submit all requests for vacation home checks at least a week ahead of your departure!

Cat Information at FPCA March General Meeting

Paula & Jay Mathew spoke at the March 2015 FPCA meeting and discussed the concerns of all of the Community cats in neighborhoods all over Columbus and other cities. Feral cats are domestic cats. Like pet cats. The difference is that feral cats have had little or no contact with humans, and so they are fearful of us and cannot be adopted. They have a home—the outdoors.

And, there is a simple way you can help them: Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR). This program ends reproduction, stabilizes feral cat populations, and improves individual cats' lives. The behaviors and stresses associated with mating—pregnancy, yowling, and fighting—stop.

Trap: Humanely trap all of the cats in a colony (a group of cats living outdoors together). **Neuter:** Take the cats in their traps to a veterinarian or clinic to be neutered, vaccinated, and eartipped (a universal symbol indicating they have been neutered). **Return:** Return the cats to their original outdoor home.

Jay & Paula Mathew work with Cat Welfare, Colony Cats & Alley Cats to trap, neuter and return feral cats in the north end of Columbus. Cat Welfare can sell you vouchers @ \$10/cat to spay or neuter. There is also a \$10 administrative fee for up to 8 vouchers. These vouchers are good for 45 days and allow you to go several low cost clinics in the central Ohio area. You can reach Jay & Paula at 614-947-9259. They can assist you in TNR.
