If your complaint concerns a car parked in a yard, it is a code violation and should be reported to 311 by phone or on line. If you report the violation on line you will be given a tracking number. You may send me the tracking number, and I'll try to help in this matter. If the car or truck is park partly in the street and partly in the grass, it is a police matter. You may report it to the police at 614-645-4545 *. I understand that people are reluctant to call the police on their neighbor. If you let me know, the address of the offender, I'll report it for you. A further complaint has been that there are trash and recycle cans set out early or left out for days. The cans may be placed out at the curb up to 12 hours before pick up and must be remove within 24 hours after pick up. I hope this information helps.



Please call the Columbus Police Non-Emergency number at <u>614-645-4545</u> and press the * (star) button to bypass the automated menu and get directly to the dispatcher. Of course if it is an emergency and you or others could be in danger of physical harm, then call 911.

Potholes, Headaches on our Roads

As the weather warms, along with spring flowers, one other spring visitor pops up--potholes! The City of Columbus encourages residents to help with their campaign to stamp out potholes. The best way to report a pothole is to use the city's 311 system. You can call the 311 Service Center all year to report potholes at (614) 645-3111 (some phones will let you dial just 311). E-mail requests may be sent to 311@Columbus.gov. Or you can use the city's 311 system online at www.311.columbus.gov. You may file a report anonymously there, or if you want to track the progress of the request, you can create a login ID. Note that multiple requests are combined--your request may already have been reported and thus may be closed. The city prioritizes pothole reports. Please do not use broad descriptions when pointing out potholes, such as "several potholes on Morse Road between I-71 and Cleveland Avenue" and "lots of potholes in Forest Park." Be as specific as you can: Requests should include the address or intersection of the pothole or mention of the closest school or a nearby landmark or familiar store or some other indication as to where the pothole can be quickly located. While the city does have a Facebook page for this, as a city employee must take the Facebook requests and manually enter them into the system, which can delay

repairs. Calls or e-mails are the fastest ways to get potholes reported and patched. We will let you know if and when the city has its annual pothole-fixing drive. Thanks to City Liaison Dick Graham for providing this information. Submitted by Ken Gilbert

February 9, 2016 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by 2016 President Ed Vanasdale at 7:00pm and started with the Pledge of Allegiance by all in attendance. Roll call of the officers was taken by the secretary.

President Ed Vanasdale, opened with his remarks stating that the intersection at Karl and Sandalwood is being looked at by the city to possibility to add dash marks to help drivers turn around the islands to avoid possible accidents. He also stated that the Forest Park Pool property has been determined by the city that the pool needs to be filled in and building torn down by December 31 2016 and hopefully this would entice a new buyer to purchase land for use. Ed ended his remarks by stating the Dick Graham would not be at the meeting and if anyone had issues to bring up to him he would be happy to forward them on.

At 7:07pm Columbus Police Officer Scott Clinger came up to speak about some of the issues he has seen in the area. After introducing himself to the new in attendance he stated the main issue they have dealing with is car break-ins, mostly of people leaving their cars unlocked. He stated the importance of locking car doors because the majority of people will not break windows to get into a car unless there is something visible for them to do so. However, an unlocked door gives them access to the trunks where people store items. Officer Clinger did state that even if you leave your car unlocked and your car is broken into to please still report so they can track trends in order to catch those responsible. Also reminded people about warming up their cars in the winter months and to try and only do so if you can be with your car or have a remote starter where the doors can remain locked.

In regards to the new hotel compliance laws, Officer Clinger thanked the FPCA for their help in getting this law put into motion. It helped in the closing of the Extended Suits on Morse Road for the violations it had. He stated that it is the help of community involvement that gets these types of initiatives started, the officers themselves can only say so much. Under the new law, any city officials are able to go into the hotels that open and do inspections and the hotel owners permits can be tested which can lead to closure of the hotels.

At 7:28 the committee reports began with the Treasure report given by Dan Hartzell. For this month the budget added income from the Forester and Welcome Committee and had expenses going to Supplemental Security, island maintenance and Welcome Committee directories. Overall the budget was in the hole for the month, but will likely be that way until memberships start to come in for 2016. The report was voted on and approved by the board.

PJ Phillips gave the Business Membership and Welcome Committee reports saying that one new business membership came in from Forest Park Windows. For the Welcome Committee report she gave options for printing bids for the new welcome folders. She stated that the cost for folders would be offset by ad space sold within them and the number of folders being ordered should last for about 3 years. The board discussed the options, voted on and approved to go Vista print to get new folders printed.

Felix Quachey started his Supplemental Security report by reminding residents that if they see a crime going to call the police to report first not to supplement security. Supplemental security, while being around to observe and report issues happening in the area do not have total authority to stop a crime in progress. Felix asked since there was additional money for additional shifts for when the weather warms up. The Treasure stated there were and if the need was felt it would be discussed. Otherwise Felix stated the neighborhood has remained quiet. Felix then stated the NCC report from the meeting he went to. He said that the NCC pointed out some programs that the YMCA and Libraries were starting and encouraged residents to reach out to them for information. Felix also stated that the city has had to cut \$600K from the code enforcement budget which would affect their ability to hire and replace retiring workers. However, with our area being very active we should not see too many changes. Also the Morse Road renovation plan was extended another 10 years and plans were being discussed to do the same for 161.

In Public Relations Mary Sguerra stated the new island signs will be put up and is looking to do maintenance on the sign holders in the spring. She stated she is looking into dates for the spring garage sale.

Dave Paul gave the membership report stating the no new memberships had been received at this point and brought up the membership fee to stay either stay the same or raise it to cover additional cost. The board discussed and agreed that keeping the same membership and increasing the number of memberships by 25 would cover the cost associated with it. At 8:03pm the board opened discussion of when to start mailing membership packets for this year. Dates to be determined at the next meeting.

At 8:07pm the board opened to new business to discuss by any of the residents in attendance. Two residents stated there were having issues with a neighbor and wanted to know who and how to address to the problems. The board gave her information as to what was a police issue or a city code issue and gave the appropriate steps for them to take. They reminded all residents that the association was there to help them resolve issues so even if they reach out to the city or police to let the FPCA know so they can help follow up and see the issue is resolved.

The February 2016 meeting was adjourned at 8:25pm by Ed Vanasdale.

Malik Moore is the new director of the North YMCA. He is sharing his first impressions of Forest Park with whomever will listen. He tells how he is seeing neighboring taking place in simple, but profound ways, things he has not felt or seen in other places where he has lived.

Malik ran out gas and before he could get out of his car someone was pushing the car into the Y lot. He put in enough gas to almost make it to a station and he ran out again. And again before he could get out of his car two guys were pushing him into the station. One offered him \$10.00 to get gas. This is just one of many stories that he is broadcasting to the immediate world.

A recent conversation with a visitor to the North Y confirms Director Moore's story. Gil told me he belongs to a newer Y, a nicer facility in a different part of Columbus. He has started coming to our Y because the people are much more friendly. The staff see him as a person. All the Y's are great at welcoming, but the North Y in his words, "goes a little friendlier." It reflects the community he surmised. He is right. Forest Park is special.

One other thing that we can pick up from what Gil had to say is our Y is nearly 50 years old. The facility needs work. Good news! The fitness center is getting a complete makeover. It is going to be wonderful. Please plan to check it out at the end of April when the Y has its fitness center grand reopening. Steve Ives is the new CEO for the Metro Y. He is singing the praises of our neighborhood as well. On the top of his agenda is to help us give the youth in our community a place to grow. He is impressed with the people in Forest Park.

Scores of success stories have been told recently about the young people from our community coming up through the Y. Forest Park can be proud.
