Remember, blocking the sidewalk with your car or parking a car in the yard are both violations. Neither is acceptable. Blocking the sidewalk is a police violation, call the Columbus Police at 614-645-4545* to report. Parking in the yard is a code violation, you should call 311. Thank you for all your help. We hope to see you at our next meeting on April 12.

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As I visit the businesses in our area I am amazed at the wonderful things that are out there. Meeting with Mr. Chen, the owner of Lucky Bamboo and his manager Prisna Manirochana, was no exception.

First off let me say the food was exquisite. I tasted new flavors. Chen is a chef with 30 years' experience. He has created all his own sauces. Every meal has his very own signature taste.

As a chef in China he said the food was very bland. As a chef in Los Angeles the food had to become bolder. Surprisingly in Ohio he had to make the flavors even stronger. The dishes most familiar to us Sweet and Sour Chicken, General Tso Chicken, etc. have much more sugar and spices than in China.

On special order, Mr. Chen will make a traditional meal for you. Americans typically do not like food the way it is prepared in China. Szechuan Fish is the whole fish and very bland. If you want it that way no one will prepare it better.

After serving as head chef for Lee Garden on Sawmill, Chen opened a Lucky Bamboo in Newark in 2005. It has been a great success. People convinced him to open in Columbus. He needs your business. If you remember, the space he occupies on Karl Road was once an unsavory bar. If we want to keep something good here we need to support him. PJ Phillips took a group of 10 there and got 20 thumbs up. The parade committee met there and immediately reserved for our next meeting.

The atmosphere was authentic, but not ornate.

FPCA Security Report

I am happy to report that crime in our neighborhood is down! This fact was firmly supported by our Columbus Police Neighborhood Liaison Officer at our last meeting. According to him, the city's stance on nuisance hotels has been a significant factor in continuing to curb a significant amount of the crimes that were taking place in Forest Park. I also would like to remind you all to continue to use the Raids Online website (www.raidsonline.com) to track crime events in our neighborhood and take solace in the fact that our neighborhood HAS NOT gone to the proverbial dogs. The criminals no longer have a base of operations and have had to move on and away from Forest Park but with the weather beginning to get better however; I urge you all to continue to be vigilant.

As a reminder, last spring & summer there was a change in how burglars were entering homes. Burglars now prefer to use ground floor windows to gain access into your home. Please do NOT LEAVE ground floor windows open in your home. They serve as easy access points for burglars. I was also recently made aware of a **very easy and cost effective way to reinforce doors from being kicked in that I'd like to share with everyone!** It turns out that in most doors, the screws used to mount both the strike plate and face plate of the locking mechanism to the door and frame respectively are quite short and cannot withstand much stress. Simply swapping those screws out with longer, sturdier screws secures the parts much better to your door and helps it withstand the stress of being kicked-in much better.

I would also like to send out a plea to all our neighbors to please desist from the practice of parking vehicles in the front or side yards of your homes. Not only is this growing occurrence taking away from the beauty of our neighborhood and providing cover for burglars at night, it is also a violation of Columbus City Code. The following is taken directly from the municipal code:

3312.43 - Required surface for parking: The surface of any parking area; including but not limited to a parking, loading or stacking space; circulation area; aisle or driveway shall be designed to control storm water runoff and be improved with Portland cement, asphaltic concrete or oth**er approved hard surface other than gravel or loose fill.**continued next page

Residents parking their vehicles in the grass are subject to a notice of violation from the City of Columbus Code Enforcement Office. Repeat violations result in a court hearing in front of Judge Hawkins at the Franklin County Environmental Court. There is plenty of street space available for parking in Forest Park. Let's desist from parking in our yards! We are not that type of neighborhood. Residents who would like to report repeat violators can call 614-645-3111 and specify that they have a code enforcement issue to report.



Spring Cleaning

As the weather warms, it's time for many of us to think about spring cleaning. This often leaves items and junk that you don't know what to do with as well as lots of items to trash or recycle. Here's some spring tips. If you have large items that you wish to throw out, remember that you have to let the city know first, so they can assign a truck to pick it up. If it won't fit in the trashcan, call 311 or use the on-line 311 system (<u>311.columbus.gov</u>) to ask for a bulk trash pickup. There is a specific place on that site to request a bulk pickup. You can also use the 311 system to report bulk trash at other houses that has not been picked up. However, do not use the bulk trash link for this--it only is to be used for your own bulk trash. Use the link under new service requests for "remove trash and debris along a city street". This is also a time to clean up your yards and gardens for the new planting season. Yard waste pickup (and recycling) schedules are on our webpage, <u>www.fpcivic.org.</u> Remember, recycling and yard waste (in separate receptacles) are now collected on the same day. Finally, you may find you have some items that still have some useful life left in them. Don't forget to take advantage of the Spring Forest Park Garage Sale, on April 30. Keep an eye out for registration information



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
