Supplemental Security News



Forest Park Residents,

With the weather beginning to get cooler outside it is important that our vigilance remain high! Here are a few things to consider:

- ♦ **Continue to keep your ground floor windows locked.**
- ♦ **Pay attention to your fence gates both as you leave your home and as you return—are they locked as you left them, or are they now open?**
- ♦ **When the leaves and subsequently snow comes down, pay attention to tracks left in the snow or leaves around your home for evidence of unusual traffic around your home other than the mailman or other delivery personnel.**
- ♦ **With holiday shopping season getting ready to start, be sure to have your packages delivered to you at work or to a neighbor's home who you know will be available to sign for them. Don't make you home an easy target.**
- ♦ **Always answer your doorbell! Do not open the door and expose yourself to being attacked! Simply making it known you are home in many cases will deter a burglar from breaking in as they would rather be charged with a burglary when caught than with a robbery.**
- ♦ **Always lock the entry door from your garage into your home.**

As always, if something looks out of place to you, pay attention and report it by way of the Columbus Police Non-Emergency line at 614-645-4545 and then press * when the machine picks up to be connected to a live operator and they will be happy to dispatch a car to investigate.

Attention all residents: Please send all your vacation home check requests at least a full week ahead of your departure. We need a little lead time for our patrol officer to adjust his schedule if the need arises.

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Forest Park Civic Association Meeting Tuesday October 10, 2016 Minutes

Columbus Police Officers took questions from neighbors about incidents in the neighborhood. Folks were encouraged to attend the monthly Forest Park Block Watch meetings for further information. Officer Klinger was recognized in Washington, D.C. by an invite of the U.S. Attorney General for an award on Neighborhood Policing. He was 2 of 12 officers nationwide to receive this award.

Next, roll call was taken by Ken Gilbert, past-president.

Neighborhood News – The new Kroger Building on Morse Road will open October 19th at 10:00am. There is a new strip center that will be built in front of the Kroger store.

Guest Speaker for the evening – Mr. Tran of ABC Liquor on 161, & Mr. Young. Mr. Young explained about the upcoming election and that Ward 30, Precinct A will have a vote to decide for Sunday Liquor Sales at ABC Liquor. Currently, Beer/Wine are available for sale on Sunday but Mr. Tran doesn't open his store due to the liquor in the building. It was discussed that the new Kroger will have a Liquor store too. This vote is only for liquor sale at the ABC Liquor and its address for that area. Mr. Tran has assisted in the 161 Task Force to do clean up on 161 and has donated \$500 to this cause.

Treasurer Report – The Hartzell stated that monies reflect 63 new household memberships at \$25 each and 3 new business memberships at \$60 each. The balance at the end of September is \$11,254.92 with a net income for September to be \$215.78

Volunteer Report – Mike Stone reported a group of neighbors met 2 weeks ago and reviewed the existing list of folks listed interest in volunteering on the membership form. This consisted of 22 pages of names. The group was checking with those names on the list to see if they are willing to volunteer at this time for any specific area. The group will meet again in 2 week to see what the results are from checking with those folks on the list.

Forester Newsletter – Rita Woeste reminded folks that the upcoming November Forester will only be ONLINE. Articles were requested to be sent to Rita by Friday, October 21st.

Public Relations – Mary Sguerra told the group that the Garage Sale was a success again with 15+ folks listing their garage sales for the day.

Welcome Committee – Donna Vanasdale asked for folks to help with delivery of Welcome Folders to new residents in the neighborhood and they could take them with them after the meeting.

Other News – The old Sequoia Pool has until December 31st to get the old pool filled in with dirt. There was not mention of what needed to be done with the existing building.

New Business- 2017 Budget. Dan Hartzell, treasurer, stated that the budget year needs to match the membership year, so he was requesting a partial year budget til the it lines up with membership timeline mid next year 2017. He also asked for anyone to contribute concerns or info they might have to helping with the budget. The urgency for this change to the budget is due to the loss of monies we are having each month with expenses of security and Forester print costs and lower than normal memberships for the year. He stated the executive committee will have a meeting at the Treasurer's house to further look at this budget and report back at a future meeting.

There was a motion made and second to increase business memberships from \$60 to \$75 starting in January 2017. This motion was passed. There was a 2nd proposal to increase cost of ads in the Forester and limit the size of ads. Cost for back page ad is \$200, full page ad \$195. Each issue will sell up to 4 Quarter page ads, 8 business page ads, and 2, half page ads per issue. This is a total of 5 pages of ads for a 12 page newsletter. The motion was made, 2nd and passed by the group. This will go into effect with the 2017 year.

There was a group discussion about how to raise money for the FPCA with one idea of possibly raising household memberships. Another consideration was what percentage of our memberships should cover supplemental security and do folks want more security or issues of the Forester. This discussion was tabled til a later meeting.

The FPCA meeting was adjourned at 8:22 pm
