President's Message—Info to know By Ed Vanasdale

I want to inform all residents of Forest Park that in the future starting in April there will be changes to the FPCA and the Block Watch meetings. John Biteman who has been the Block Watch coordinator for severval years will be stepping down as of March 31, 1917. Since no one was willing to step into his position and since we did not want to lose such a vital resource to our community, Ken Gilbert and I have decided to be co-leaders of the Block Watch starting in April of 2017. In order to accomplish this, the Block Watch meeting will move to the second Tuesday of each month from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm at the Epworth Methodist Church. Our community liaison officer, Scott Clinger, will only be available to give information and answer questions from the group between 6:00 and 6:30. He will no longer be attending the FPCA meetings after March. If you can not make the meetings at the earlier time, you may e-mail me your question to me at evanasdale@insight.rr.com. I must have your e-mail by 3:00 pm on the Tuesday of the meeting. I will be happy to ask your question of Officer Clinger and forward his reponse to you. All police issues will be discussed at the Block Watch meeting since Officer Clinger will not be attending the FPCA meeting. The FPCA meeting will take place on the same evening at the Epworth Church from 7:00 to 8:00 pm. The FPCA meeting will end promptly at 8.00 pm. We will have guest speakers at 7:00 who will be of interests to both groups. The speakers will be varied so that one month FPCA issues will be discussed and the next month speakers will be of more concerns with Block Watch issues. Code issues, i.e. cars parked in yards, trash in yards, etc., which are not of concerned of the police, will be discussed at the FPCA meeting. The difference between police issues and code issues will be explained at our April meeting.

The guest speaker at the 7:00 pm April 11 FPCA meeting will be Christopher Rinehart representing Fresh Eats which is a division of Kroger. Fresh Eats proposes the construction of a 10 to 15.000 square foot store at the intersection of Cleveland Avenue and Bretton Woods Drive. Hope to see you at meeting or meetings next month.

So it looked for a moment that spring was here only for a late wintry spell to remind us that we live in Central Ohio and the weather is unpredictable. During this short period of warm weather, I noticed on many occasions the sort of behavior that leaves us exposed to criminal elements that seek to prey on us. Even at our meeting this past Tuesday, March 14th, our Columbus Police Liaison Officer pointed out to us to be mindful out the following:

- Do not leave your garage door up as you complete yard work or ferry groceries from one's car into the house-I noticed on many occasions while driving through the neighborhood, residents in the process of emptying their vehicles with their garage doors up, their backs to the street and completely oblivious to a sneak attack. Please refrain from making yourselves a target.
- Do not leave valuables in plain sight when left in cars in the driveway and ALWAYS lock your vehicles even when parked in the garage.
- Any vendor coming to your door to sell their services are required by city code to have a Peddler's License. It is a photo ID card with their name on it. Be sure to check the city peddler's license against another form of ID. Do not conduct business with anyone coming to your door without one.
- Make sure to always lock the door leading from your garage into your home!; and lastly,
- Do not leave ground floor windows open as they make an easy point of entry into your home!

I realize that this sounds like a broken record; however, these same behaviors are among some of the leading contributors to the crimes our residents fall victim to.



I also want to remind members using regular mail to send in their vacation-check requests to make sure that their forms are placed in the mail a whole week ahead of their planned departure date. Note that you can also email your request. If the requests aren't received in a timely manner, we cannot guarantee that your home-check will make the schedule in time to get your home patrolled while you are away.

Furthermore, there seems to be some confusion about what Supplemental Security actually does. Unfortunately, we are NOT an on-demand patrol service. I receive a number of calls asking if we can send a car to come investigate one thing or another each month. Even if we had the funding to provide that service, we do not have the same authority as the Columbus Police and cannot issue tickets or arrest anyone. If you see what looks to be a crime in progress call either 911 if it qualifies as an emergency or if it's a non-emergency, call 614-645-4545 and then press * to by-pass the recording and get to dispatch directly. If you do not identify yourself, your call will not be treated urgently. Note that the police will not identify you to the persons you report as the one that called in.

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Keep the Forester Happening

Do you like getting the Forester? It is the primary way Forest Park communicates still. It takes some effort to write it, edit it, print and distribute it. Rita, our editor, puts in by far the most time, effort and talent. Insley Printing takes care of the obvious at a wonderfully low cost. He delivers them to us whenever and wherever we need them.

The rest of us take care of the distribution. Volunteers stuff them into bags. We share the delivery of the 2880 to the homes in Forest Park with a youth group. Right now we have three youth group partners, Northland High School STEM, Beechcroft High School STEM and The North Y Leaders Club.

They get \$250.00 from Forest Park toward their programs.

They can get \$200.00 for each business that gives us a one page ad to be put in the bag with the Forester.

A business pays \$500.00 and gives us 3000 ads. The \$300.00 difference goes toward printing the Forester.

Mark Robbins, Pharmacist/ Manager, of the Happy

Druggist told me he had an increase of 13% in business from his ad page in the bag. He said over 50 people have come into the store with the ad. That is a great return on an ad. It targets a specific neighborhood. If you have a business you ought to consider this. If you have a friend with a business do them a favor and tell them about this. Mark if planning on doing it again.

Consider joining us at Donatos at 2:00 pm to help us stuff the Forester into the bags. The next one is April 21. We have a blast.

Consider taking a walk for good health. While you are at it you might as well deliver a Forester on your street. We have a person who delivers 17, one that delivers 178 and various numbers in between. It takes me about 30 minutes to deliver 45 newsletters.

Finally, it is necessary to have two people work with me on planning and organizing the delivery. I recruit people to stuff and deliver, make up the schedules and organize the stuffing and delivery. I am the only one who does this. If I am not around to do it I think it would not get done. We would not have a Forester. It is wise to have a couple people know how to do this. If you enjoy the Forester and see it has value, please consider joining me.

Meeting was started at 7:05pm with President Ed Vanasdale leading the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Attendance was taken and recorded by Cate Gilbert.

Treasurer's Report: Dan Hartzell presented the February report. Interest earned was 11 cents. FPCA net income for February was \$145.98. Our year to date amount is -\$377.63, but Dan reported we are doing better than expected with the planned budget because we are down less money than expected at this time of year before the membership drive.

Police Liason: Officers Klinger and Oretega discussed that an area of potential problems as the weather gets warmer is solicitors that come to our doors. They reminded the group that solicitors must have a picture ID on a Columbus Permit on their clothing in order to come knocking at your door. Solicitors are allowed to come door to door til 8 pm. If you have a person you are not sure is licensed you can call the Police radio room at 614-345-4545 and hit the star button. The officers also reminded folks to not leave garage doors open or leave a garage door opener in your parked car in the driveway.

Blockwatch: The March meeting will be the last one with president, Jon Biteman will be stepping aside after this month. Blockwatch meetings will be moved to the hour prior to the FPCA meeting each month.

<u>Northland Community Council</u>: Northland Shredding Day will be Saturday, May 13th from 10-2 pm at Kroger Parking Lot on Morse Road. They will be accepting Food donations for Mid Ohio Food Bank and a pharmacy medicine drop off will be part of the day. The NCC Volunteer Banquet will take place April 12th at Little Turtle Country Club. Cost is \$35/dinner. Matt Barnes from WCMH, Channel 4 will host the event. FPCA will be honoring George Schmidt and Jon Biteman.

<u>FPCA Budget</u>: Dan reviewed the yearly budget chart and explained our budget is watched closely due to lower membership numbers. An explanation was given how we utilize the supplemental security services and the hours they patrol are based on income generated from memberships. The budget was approved.

FPCA : Plans are to do another summer picnic for residents of Forest Park. The spring Garage Sale will be Saturday May 20th and Mike will work to find volunteers to pass our garage sale listings on the morning of May 20th. A discussion of concern came up about all of the semi trucks parked in the alley at Tamarack Circle.

Forester: Articles are needed for the April issue by this Friday, March 17th. We will do a mail membership and Forester with the May issue. Rita will check with Insley printers to see what dates work best to accommodate the stuffing day for membership forms on April 22nd. The number of ads and their sizes needs to be reviewed to make sure we have room for articles and ads for each issue.

<u>FPCA Security:</u> Felix reports things have been quiet.

Welcome Committee: Donna said she had folders for new residents in Areas 4, 5, 9, 10.

NCC: Felix restated the information about Shredding Day and the Volunteer Banquet. NCC had two issues at their meeting: First one for LED lighting approval at a hotel by Easton and 2^{nd} was the parking variance for Church Residences and the complex they are building on Maple Canyon behind the CVS.

<u>Membership Committee:</u> Mike Stone reported that stuffing day for the membership drive will take place at Schoedinger on April 22^{nd} from 1-4 pm. We will stuff membership forms along with newsletters into one mailing. Mike stated they are also looking at what folks signed up to do as a volunteer and get some contacts out to those folks for events like Gabby's Night in June and 4th of July Parade.

FPCA meeting was adjourned at 8:35 pm.
