Not being able to swim seems like an easy fix. Take your kids to swim lessons. There are lots of places to sign up. One cannot learn swim on line.



Great Progress on East Dublin Granville Road

Kudos are pouring in for the display of 500 flags down the corridor on June 14. A big THANK YOU to the Flag Lady Store and Andy Levitt. Thank you, to everyone who sponsored a flag for \$30.00. A total of 495 flags were sponsored. The mowing of 980,000 square feet of grass cost \$1360 each time. That is a bargain. \$10890 of the flag sponsor proceeds will go toward cutting grass. This almost covers the summer.

Thank you, to Forest Park residents. You sponsored lots of flags, were there for the June 9 cleanup, some of you take care of 8 of the landscape boxes and attended the Flag Day celebration. The celebration went well with about 250 people. The North Y provided activities for the children. Spicy Cup Bakery, Podunk's, Taco Nazo and the Hindu Temple supplied free samples. Jeff and Lorna Duffield entertained with their calliope. The Northland HS band led us in the Star-Spangled Banner. AmeriCorps and Key Bank volunteered services.

We kicked off our Taste of 161 Restaurant Passport. Pick one up at the Ink Well and many other places. They will be at the next Forest Park meeting. Eat at the 15 restaurants by the end of the year and receive a \$25 gift card.

Discussions are getting serious about The Continent and Giant Eagle. Councilmember Remy, the NCC as well at the 161 Task Force are pushing to have something done for the area. The city should do a Market study. NCC has ideas. There will be one building opening for small businesses. This is only in the discussion stage but some ideas are a small venue convention space or restaurant test kitchens. It is all moving in the right direction.

We have a commitment from the City and COTA to do something about the awful bus stops on 161. They plan to put concrete pad for customers to stand on rather that in the ditch. They are addressing the damage the buses are causing on the service roads. They are telling us they will put in trash containers.



"Keys" to keeping Forest Park a great place to live!

It's an exciting time to live in Forest Park (FP)—property is appreciating; new neighbors looking to make it their home are moving in. FP continues to be a safe, great location nestled close to work & all the conveniences of Columbus. Its history is a place where neighbors get to know one another & help each other— I believe we all wish for that small neighborhood feel to continue!!

Get to know your surrounding neighbors, exchange info & watch out for one another!

Consider participating in our FP Block Watch. Meets 2nd Tuesday/month at 6 pm. Columbus Police Dept. (CPD) Officers usually attend to take questions, address concerns & provide updates. Held at Epworth United Methodist Church at 5100 Karl Rd.

We are the eyes & ears for the CPD so report any suspicious activity appropriately. If an emergency or a crime in progress, call 911. For non-emergencies, call 614-645-4545, then *. It is better to provide contact info & CPD Officers now have the capability to follow-up by text on the outcome from your call.

Using the Nextdoor App to share info with neighbors is great, but while the CPD can post items, they cannot see our posts unless you reply to one of theirs so please contact the CPD directly when appropriate. Maintain your home & yard. It is the neighborly thing to do! It shows you care & respect your neighbors/ neighborhood. If you are new to maintaining a home/yard, don't hesitate to reach out to a neighbor for help or guidance.

Parking on grassy areas of your property is a Code violation for which you can be cited & parking where you block the sidewalk can result in a ticket from a Police Officer.

If we all pick up trash found in front of our properties, our streets will remain clear of litter.

When walking your dog, be considerate & clean up after them.

Light up the outside of your property. It's one of the best ways to deter crime. The hope is one day we will have attractive street lighting, but until then, let's light up our houses & sidewalks ourselves!

Be proud of your street # and visibly display it so visitors and emergency vehicles can find you!

Those 90 gallon garbage cans are really not attractive so do your best to place them on your property where less obtrusive. By City Code they should not be placed at the street more than 24 hrs before pick up & then removed within 24 hrs of collection. Our trash color is RUBY. Go to www.311.columbus.gov to print a schedule of your collection days for trash/recycling/yard waste or to schedule a bulk pickup.

Columbus's 311 system is a great resource for info plus to report concerns/pot holes/code violations, etc. You can call 614-645-3111 or you can do so on-line at the address noted above. You can submit anonymously; however, it is better to provide contact info so you have the ability to track your "service request" within their system.

Only the City can plant trees in the grassy areas between the street & sidewalk. They are also responsible for maintaining those trees so if they need attention, contact 311. The Forestry Division is extremely backlogged so it may take some time before they address your concern; however, storm damage/emergency situations may likely be escalated.

Support the Forest Park Civic Association (FPCA)! Having a viable civic association gives us standing with the Northland Community Council (NCC) and the City of Columbus allowing us to weigh in on matters of importance to our neighborhood, plus we are given liaisons/channels to work with the City & representation on the NCC. The FPCA is made up of volunteers—please consider being one. There are many opportunities to help for just a single occasion or on-going or something in between!

The membership fee is only \$25 a year—less than a special cup of coffee/tea or an ice cream treat once a month!!! That \$25, however, can make a real difference to all of us as a whole.

The membership fees go to providing extra security patrols & vacation house checks, maintaining the entry islands at Sandalwood & Karl, and publishing The Forester, our newsletter, which is now primarily being delivered by some of your volunteer neighbors.

The volunteers who contribute with their various skill sets make the FPCA what it is to our neighborhood! Many hands make light work for all! We hope you will take an opportunity to attend one of our meetings held the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 7 pm at Epworth UMC at 5100 Karl Rd. and explore opportunities to volunteer and be of service to your neighborhood.

Utilizing those famous words of President Kennedy: "Ask not what your [neighborhood/FPCA] can do for you, ask what you can do for your [neighborhood/FPCA]"!

The Birds of Boxwood

If yes, make and model of car

We moved to Boxwood Drive in Forest Park West in September of 2016. One of the things we liked about the area were the mature trees throughout the neighborhood, because we like birds.

Our kitchen window overlooks a long, narrow backyard. We planted a line of Thujas as a natural bit of privacy and because we knew that birds would shelter in the evergreen branches. And between the line of trees and the house, we set up a few shepherd's hooks from which we hung a variety of feeders.



As with many things, birdwatching and feeding started slowly - one tube feeder, one finch sock, a shallow bird bath we found at an auction one summer. As we have seen the kinds of birds that visit our yard, we have changed our feeders accordingly.

We currently have two tube feeders which we fill with a mix of sunflower seeds, millet, cracked corn and peanut pieces. This mix is especially enticing to House Sparrows, House Finches, Cardinals, Blue Jays, Mourning Doves and Grackles.

We hang two finch feeders - a 'sock' variety and a tube variety. At one point we had a black sock and the birds absolutely loved it. But once it deteriorated, we could only find a standard white sock replacement. House Finches and American Goldfinches frequent the finch feeders all year long. The Goldfinch males are brilliant yellow this time of year.



We put out an Oriole feeder this year after seeing these gorgeous, flashy birds last spring as they flitted to and from feeders that a restaurant up in Grand Rapids, OH put out. La Roe's attracts the birds every year by filling their feeders with grape jelly. We tried to attract Orioles to our yard in the fall, hoping the reverse migration would send some birds our way, but we did not see one until May of this year. Our Oriole feeder is well stocked with grape jelly and after the initial sighting, we added a feeder that holds grape jelly and orange slices. We are anxiously awaiting another visit!

Two of our favorite feeders are flat, red trays that hang from shepherd's hooks. The trays are welcoming to birds of every size. It's not uncommon to see two Mourning Doves sitting side by side in a tray, eating their breakfast together. Blue Jays, Grackles, Cardinals all love the trays. We've also had Chipping Sparrows, Black Cap Chickadees, Brown Headed Cowbirds, Carolina Wrens, and a White Crowned Sparrow in those trays.

We have two birdbaths - one is very shallow and freezes over in the winter. The other is slightly deeper and is heated. Yes, there is such a thing as a heated bird bath! We get tons of visitors to it when everything else is solid ice. Both birds and squirrels really seem to appreciate access to drinking water in the colder months. Robins visit all the water sources, even in the winter, when their feathers are puffed up to hold in warmth. I have a great picture of a 'fat Robin' sitting on the edge of the heated bird bath taken in January.

Dark Eyed Juncos are some of our winter inhabitants. They tend to stay on the ground to eat seed dropped from the many feeders.

Starlings arrive in loud, clumsy waves, scare away the other birds and eat everything. They're lovely to look at but their rude behavior makes them not my favorites!

Never ones to pass up food or water, the local squirrels have also become quite fond of our yard. They, too, will sit in the red trays eating seed or hang from a log feeder, stuffing as much suet in their mouths as they can. Some people dislike squirrels but I find them easy to watch. I'll toss a grape or cracker or bit of apple out the window to them and sometimes they'll sit right there and eat. Nothing that I've tossed to them has ever lasted more than a couple of hours on the ground.

The abundance of wildlife has attracted what we think is a Cooper's Hawk to build a nest in our Gumwood tree. There have been several instances of a hawk sitting on our fence, checking to see if an errant bird or squirrel would make a good meal. So far, I haven't seen any evidence that this has happened, and hope not to, though it's probably inevitable.

One resource that has been invaluable in our bird discovery journey is the Cornell Lab of Ornithology at www.birds.cornell.edu. Almost every time I've searched for an unknown bird based on a description, I have found accurate information there. I've been able listen to Cornell's recordings of calls so that I can often identify my regular and not so regular visitors by sound. It's a fascinating site and an excellent resource.



I love watching birds. I think you will, too, if you start! Thanks for Reading, Laurie
