## A Recycling Reminder:

**Do not** use the blue bins to recycle plastic bags. They get caught in the sorting machinery and can do severe damage to the machines, causing them to jam. Plastic shopping bags can be recycled at most major grocers.

Also, *do not* put objects for recycling in plastic trash bags in the bins for the



same reason. It can cause an entire load of recycling to be diverted to the landfill. I have seen this problem on a regular basis while driving around our neighborhood on out recycling day. Most blue bins have a list attached to them stating what can and cannot be recycled.

## **Unique Connections in Forest Park**

The longer a neighborhood exists, the stronger its character becomes. For Forest Park, one such characteristic is the bond that many residents build with the area. I know I can think of a lot of interesting examples.

#### A Generational Bond

For many, the neighborhood experience has been something that brings people back, or keeps them staying here. A decade ago, I had a nearby neighbor whose son purchased the home of his parents. I can recall the time when the elder was preparing to put the home on the market and was tinkering with the small repairs and upgrades one makes in advance of a listing. His son, a few years removed from his graduation from college, was by his side for weeks in preparation of the day it would be on the market. I don't know if it was the younger man's original plan or three weeks of nostalgia, but he soon made his own offer and no realtor would ever be required. Not only did the transaction keep the home under the same family name for over 40 years, but he is currently raising a third generation on that same patch of land.

Four years ago, we connected with a Forest Park family who recently moved into the neighborhood rented their parent's former home. We connected because our daughters went to the same school. The couple relocated from Dayton and one was working on her Nurse Practitioner Degree at Ohio State. The rental was a point of temporary convenience until the appropriate time where they would again own. When that time came, they made it abundantly clear that they wanted to continue living in Forest Park. Ironically, they were unable to find anything that met their space requirements because new listings either went too quick for them to make an offer, or resulted in bidding wars which priced them out in the process. They still stayed in Northland when they finally found a home in Salem on the other side of I-71.

Staying with the theme of home sales, I had a neighbor who was the subject of a Columbus Dis-



patch article highlighting Forest Park home sales. She got a very fair price at a milestone number that showed the neighborhood's continuing strength in value. While the sale was necessary for a variety of reasons, she maintained her desire to remain close to the neighborhood. It took less than a half year for that wish to happen as a condominium became available on Pegwood Ct. She remains active in the civic association and is a great neighborhood advocate.

It's been years but I can still remember an FPCA volunteer who had to be in her late 70's telling me at a civic association party that her kids were wanting her to

move to a "better neighborhood." And with all the defiance she could muster she said, "I've been in this neighborhood for over 40 years and I'm not going anywhere!!" Loved hearing it.

I'm certain that you have your own personal sentiments and stories that are similar.
