Here are some resources to beautify our community! Each year, our conservation team puts together our Spring Tree and Plant Sale. We offer different species of native plants (bare-root woody plants and trees); plug and container perennials (prairie grasses and flowering plants); seed mix (pollinator and native Ohio prairie mixes); and rotate in edible (berries, apples, mushroom kits) and live stakes (fast growing riparian species for streambank stabilization). We serve about 400 central Ohio residents and several non-profits every year by selling or donating plants. Our annual Spring Tree & Plant

Sale is a fundraiser that benefits our Conservation Fund.

Columbus 311

Do you know what it can do for YOU?

City of Columbus 311 is an amazing resource we have access to as residents of Forest Park. Columbus 311 is the service center the city provides to city residents for requesting all nonemergency city services. Residents can utilize the service by calling **614-645-3111** or online at 311.columbus.gov. In my personal experience, setting up a free account on 311.columbus.gov has been the most effective way to track what services I have requested. It saves me the task of having to write down the tracking number for the filed complaint. The tracking/report ID number is the only way to follow up on a reported issue. With my online account, I am able to also see a history of all my reported issues and what stage of resolution it is in. The current Top 10 Service Requests on the website are:

- 90-GALLON REFUSE CONTAINER NEEDS REPAIRED
- STREET LIGHT NEEDS REPAIRED
- REFUSE CONTAINER WAS NOT COL-LECTED
- ABANDONED VEHICLE ON A STREET OR ALLEY
- TRASH/DEBRIS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY
- RECYCLING CONTAINER WAS NOT COLLECTED
- REPLACE DAMAGED 90-GALLON REFUSE CONTAINER
- YARD WASTE WAS NOT COLLECTED
- TRASH/DEBRIS IN ALLEY OR CURB
- POTHOLE ON CITY STREET

Begin by calling it in to **614-645-3111** or filing it online at **311.columbus.gov**. Get the report ID number so you can track it.

If you have filed a report through the 311 system and are not seeing any action on it, please forward the report ID number to your Area Representative. It will be brought to the attention of the City Liaison Officer assigned to our area who can then push it through the appropriate channels. If there is no report ID number we cannot track it.

Additionally, note that when you have large items like old furniture, old workout equipment, etc., that you need to dispose of, the regular weekly trash crew WILL NOT pick that up off your curb. Instead, use the 311 service to schedule a Bulk Pick-Up. You will receive information on when to have the items on your curb to be picked up. This will save you and your neighbors the pain of having to look at the bulk trash and debris sitting in front of your home for weeks on end before getting picked up.

It Takes a Village . . .

Have you ever shared a meal with a neighbor? Would you consider giving your neighbor a ride to a medical appointment? Have you ever been in need of some extra help after a surgery but didn't know where to turn? Do you seek a new purpose now that you've retired? Would you like to get out and socialize more? These are all questions we need to consider as we age. Where do you want to be as you grow older?

A concept that began years ago with a group of neighbors determined to stay in their homes for as long as possible may be coming to a neighborhood near you. The Village Movement is spreading throughout the country as our population continues to age. The idea is rather simple as "neighbors helping neighbors" is the basis for these member-based non profit organizations that are proving to keep older adults in their homes two years longer than those without this type of support. While every Village is unique, most offer both a social component as well as services provided by volunteers and/or local businesses (for discounted rates). It is common for members to also serve as volunteers. Community volunteers offer an array of services that may include providing transportation, changing light bulbs, technology assistance, shoveling snow, or walking dogs (just to name a few).

The first Village was established in 2002 in the Boston neighborhood of Beacon Hill and currently has more than 400 members. Columbus is now home to three Villages: Village Connections in German Village, Village in the Ville in Clintonville, and At Home by High in the Short North and nearby neighborhoods. A fourth Village is scheduled to open this year in the Hilltop. It is my hope to bring Central Ohio's next Village to Northland, but as you may have guessed, I can't do it on my own; it takes a village. Northland has a strong network of neighborhoods, and I believe we have what it takes to support a Village.

Please join the conversation and help lay the groundwork for our own Village. Our next "Village Chat" will take place at the Karl Road Library Meeting Room on Sunday, February 3 from 1:00 - 2:30 pm. We remember Arline Ries

Longtime Forester Editor and member of the Forest Park Civic Association

It was announced at our January FPCA meeting that a very dedicated volunteer of the Forest Park Neighborhoods, Arline Ries, past away on January 5th. Arline raised her family here in Forest Park on Sandalwood Drive with her husband, Robert. She was preceded in death by the love of her life, Robert (Bob) Ries, as well as her parents Clyde and Arlene (Shadford) Boso and siblings, Charles, Robert, Gene, Ralph, Clyde Jackson and Dorothy Carol. Arline's family was the focus of her life and her sons Scott (Rhonda) Ries and Steven (Kristin) Ries, daughters Karen (John) Botti and Kathy (Alan) Chapman and step-son Gary (Marilyn) Ries were blessed to have her as their mother. She will be remembered by her grand-children Jason (Stephanie); Krista (Trent), Joshua (Kelly); Jessica (Jim); Melissa (Greg), Morgan, Drake, Tonya, John David, Sean and Emily and 12 great grand-children.

I never had the honor to meet Arline but I have heard of her and knew of her work from the many volumes of Forester Issues that I now hold in my possession as the current Forester Editor for FPCA. Arline was President, assistant Editor, Secretary and many other positions for the Forest Park Civic Association but her greatest contribution was as Editor of the Forester. I found Forester issues from 1980 all the way up to 2008 with Arline's name as head editor. That is a lot of Volunteer work. I took on this role as Editor because I considered myself good with a computer and had done some alumni newsletters but Arline was putting together the Forester before computers. Every month she would edit, type, confirm advertisements and layout the completed pages of the Forester across a bed to proof it before going to print. I had read somewhere she had a mimeograph machine in her basement to make copies of pages for the Forester. I cannot imagine the time it took to plan and cut out and lay out a monthly publication like this without the use of our current technology. Everyone who knew her said she was Forest Park and volunteered for many things in addition to raising her family and holding a job.

George Schmidt, former FPCA President wrote this of Arline: "I read about the death of Arline Ries today in the Tribute section of The Dispatch. If ever there was a neighbor in Forest Park who deserved a tribute it is Arline. I have been involved a long time and one of a few people who knew the original leaders and transitioned to the new. No one has done more for Forest Park than Arline Ries. I have seen a lot of people do a lot and were very dedicated to our community. I interviewed the founders of Forest Park who put in a lot of hours and effort. I wrote the history and produced the 50th anniversary video. No one comes close to Arline in service in time, energy, effort and success.


She made the Forester what it is today. Thousands of hours over three decades of writing, selling and editing the Forester would be enough to give her the crown. She, also, held every office. I remember Dave Paul saying at one point he thought Arline's house was the headquarters for Forest Park. In my opinion there would be no Forest Park today if it was not for Arline Ries. As if that was not enough, I understand, Arline worked tirelessly for church and veterans. She was a giving servant. God bless you Arlene. Rest in peace."






