My fellow residents, first, I can't believe summer is almost over! I hope it has been as enjoyable for you all as it has been for me and my family. I am also very excited about the increased levels of engagement with our civic association this summer. It has been a lot of fun for me to participate in many events this summer: Gabby's Night, the 4th of July Parade, our Annual Forest Park Picnic, Memorial Day Cookouts, National Night Out, and impromptu hang- outs organized by various residents of their street—shout out to the Sugarmaple Ct crew, the Arrowood Loop crew (#LoopLife), and the Rockwood Rd crew (#LivingTheDream)....and yes, we have our very own hashtags!!!In doing so, I have met many new neighbors and rekindled friendships with others I haven't seen or spoken to in a while. National Night out was especially fun for me and my family to host. I encourage you all to do more together as neighbors—it can be as simple as a Friday evening potluck/BYOB. Nothing complicated, as long as it gets more of us getting to know one another and building community! Secondly, I would like to take this opportunity to give a membership update—as of the beginning of this month we are 9 paid memberships <u>behind</u> compared to last year. This represents only 525 paid memberships out of over 2800 possible paid memberships. I am grateful to all who have sent in their paid memberships so far this year. I must say that I am disappointed with the returns so far! We have worked so hard to get membership information out to residents this year including making the entire process available online for the first time. I had hoped that we would be at or over 1000 paid memberships at this point. Your paid membership is an invaluable contribution to strengthening our neighborhood. In a recently submitted paid membership, a resident added this comment on their membership form "I have lived in Forest Park for 31 years. If memory serves me correctly, the annual membership dues has remained the same, \$25, since I have lived here with no break in service or activities. This says something about our neighborhood. Thanks to all who contribute to make our civic association work by providing money and time." We did increase our dues

from \$20 to \$25 per year some 7 years or so ago; however, we can and must do better Forest Park—please go online ASAP and submit your membership at www.fpcivic.org/join and do your bit to strengthen your community. I ask that everyone that has already paid this year encourage their neighbors to become paid members as well.

Thirdly, I would like to address another matter that I have received many complaints about—bulk trash in the front yard of homes. I have seen many instances of trash piles in front of some homes recently. It is an eyesore and I must encourage those doing it to please stop it. It takes away from the beauty of our neighborhood and affects the value of all our homes. Lastly, with many more children getting ready to head back to school, I must remind you all that the speed limit in our neighborhood is 25 MPH except when posted otherwise. ■ FORESTER DELIVERY POSITIONS

Forester Coordinator(s) Looking for 1 or 2 people. In short, responsible for assigning routes for deliverers, communicates with Forester Editor as necessary and all volunteers prior to the Stuffing Day.

Stuffing Coordinator(s) Should be handled by 2 people. In short, responsible for overseeing Stuffing Day activities, including making sure all delivery packets get distributed to deliverers

Stuffers In short, stuffers just come to the Stuffing Day and help with the stuffing and, as necessary, help with preparing the individual Door to Door packets. You don't have to do this every month, but the more folks the quicker things get done.



The most noticeable complaint that we've been seeing is people having their cars rummaged through. In most instances, the car has been left unlocked and has resulted in theft of personal property left in the vehicle. Thanks Forest Park for RECYCLING, but leave out the plastic bags PLEASE

As I've been driving around our neighborhood on recycling day, I've been proud to see Forest Park taking part in such a strong way. However, I have also noticed plastic bags sticking out of many of our blue recycling carts. That's a nono and can cause the entire recycling load to be rejected and sent to the landfill, as those bags cannot be recycled in our system (they jam the machinery, for one). The city recently began a program where carts are checked before pickup. Carts that have plastic bags or other no recyclables are tagged with a city sticker and left unemptied. This has already happened, according to neighbors on the NextDoor site, in other parts of Northland. I would expect to see it happen here in Forest Park

Acceptable items include the following (from https://www.columbus.gov/publicservice/RecyColumbus/How-To/): aluminum and steel cans and lids, flattened card-board and pizza boxes (free of food and grease), plastic bottles/jugs (but not other plastics), newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, computer paper, cereal and other dry food boxes, and phone books, glass bottles and jars,, and cartons and juice boxes (but not foil juice packs). Banned items include trash or yard waste (they are picked up separately and do not belong in the blue

cart, plastic bags, hazardous materials, syringes/needles and

medicine, Styrofoam, electronics or light bulbs, window glass, mirrors, dinnerware, ceramics, pots and pans, and food. However, there are private facilities that do recycle electronics--in some cases they will even pay for them, excepting tube TVs. Some supermarkets do recycle clean plastic bags. Please keep these rules in mind the next time you recycle. We have found over the years that the City of Columbus recycling program has reduced our garbage loads significantly, saving space in our landfills. Let's lead the way in Forest Park.



School Safety tips from Ohio AAA

Be sure to drive carefully when school is in session

- Watch for children on their way to and from school.
- Obey all school zone signs, signals, and markings.
- Look for AAA School Safety Patrollers and crossing guards.
- Watch your speed.
- Avoid using cell phones or driving while distracted, especially around school zones.
- Remember to use seat belts and appropriate child safety seats or booster seats when transporting children.

Getting Children To School Safely

Making our children safer

Regardless of how children commute to school, they face many traffic safety hazards. Research shows that taking a school bus is by far the safest way for children to travel to school. For many reasons, parents may choose other methods for getting kids to school. Motor vehicle crashes are the greatest threat children face, and about 1 in every 5 children (ages 5-9) who dies in a traffic crash is a pedestrian.

Should your child walk to school or the bus stop?

Walking is great exercise for kids, but it's up to parents to decide if walking is safe. Here are some things to consider:

Your child's age: Children under 10 usually don't have the skills to navigate alone in areas with traffic. Think about the readiness of each child, regardless of age, to face dangerous traffic.

Traffic itself: The volume and speed of traffic may not allow for a safe route.

Crime: High crime areas can also put children at risk.

Crosswalks, street signs, and traffic signals: These items help protect drivers and children from traffic crashes.

Crossing guards and AAA School Safety Patrollers: These helpers are often present to assist children in crossing intersections safely.

Distance to the school or bus stop: The further children have to walk, the greater the risk of mishap.
