My fellow residents,

I am sad to report that one of our residents was recently robbed at gunpoint on Satinwood Dr. just south of Pegwood Ct as they took a walk on the night of September 15th. The robber approached them under the guise of asking for the time. After walking away, he came back and asked for directions somewhere and it was during this exchange that he pulled a gun on our neighbors. If you are a member of our Facebook Group—Forest Park Community (Official) you have heard the whole story. The perpetrator didn't take any valuables—i.e. rings, phones, or wallet—instead he marched them to the Chase ATM on SR-161 and made them withdraw cash for him under duress. Fortunately, they came away from this harrowing experience with no physical injuries.

As saddened as I am about them experiencing this, I am also very moved by their compassion and mental fortitude in immediately alerting the 360 members of our Facebook Group so we could all more vigilant as we go about our daily routines. I was also moved by the outpouring of support for them in the group and how grateful residents were that they took the time to immediately warn as many residents as they could. We do live in a community that is very safe overall and we must not let this experience shake our sense of safety in our own backyards. This could've happened to anyone anywhere. I ask that we all come together and take small steps to ensure that we greatly reduce the probability of this ever happening to another resident ever again:

- 1 Since we don't have street lights in our neighborhood (an ongoing struggle between many other neighboring communities and the city; including ourselves), let's all do well to avoid working out after the sun goes down in areas like this intersection which is so dark.
- 2. Use a bright, portable flashlight on evening walks. Your flashlight beam, moving around erratically under duress can draw attention to your plight. This is attention your robber doesn't want.
- 3. Stay in populated areas especially after dark and always maintain situational awareness.
- 4. Let's all take the time to get to know our neighbors that you see out for a walk on a regular basis past your homes. Get to know them and their routines so you can recognize situations that don't seem quite right. Lastly; and most importantly,
- 5. Agree on a route you are walking and check-in and out with a neighbor or family member when you are heading out for a walk. Text updates so they know you are back and have them know to check on you if you haven't checked back in (safe at home) or if your walk is taking longer than usual.

Let's recommit to working harder to being our neighbors' keeper!

Reminder of what neighbors need to know

NO BULK ITEMS WILL BE COLLECTED UNLESS THE RESIDENT <u>SCHEDULES COLLECTION ONLINE</u> OR CALLS 645-3111

Follow these guidelines:

- To schedule collection of bulk items, contact the City's 311 Service Center ((614) 645-3111) or 311.columbus.gov
- If your regular trash is picked up at the curb, place bulk items in front of your home away from obstructions on your specially scheduled collection day.
- If your regular trash is picked up in an alley, place bulk items on the edge of your property at the alley line on your specially scheduled collection day.
- Roll carpet into a bundle 4 feet long by 2 feet in diameter and tie it with rope.
- Leave furniture assembled.
- Glass must be taped.
- Residents are responsible for cleaning up any glass residue that may remain on the ground in front of their home as a result of collection.
- Bags, boxes, storage tubs, luggage and/or open containers of trash are not considered bulk. Bags and boxes of items must be placed inside your designated refuse container for collection. Plastic or metal trash cans/containers and storage tubs placed out with bulk collection must be empty and will be discarded
- Items resulting from an eviction, set-out, or foreclosure will not be collected.

Unacceptable Items

Some items cannot be collected by the City of Columbus. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Hazardous, flammable or explosive materials;
- Auto parts and tires;
- Excavating and building materials;
- Refrigerated appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, heat pumps, water coolers and air conditioners);
- Furnaces, Pianos, Spas, Hot tubs or pool tables

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Tips for a Safe Trick or Treat Night

Swords, knives, and other costume accessories should be short, soft, and flexible

Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.

Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you. WALK and don't run from house to house.

Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.

Look both ways before crossing the street. Use crosswalks wherever possible.

Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.

Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.

Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing <u>decorative</u> <u>contact lenses</u>.

Only walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.

Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.

Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.

Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Never accept rides

Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

Traditions

During my time in Forest Park, I have noticed how traditions endure over generations, even when many think those traditions are no longer.

October is such an example with the tradition of Halloween and trick or treat. When my wife and I joined the neighborhood as newly-weds in the late 90s, we were surrounded by older families who reminisced about past beggar's nights. They were a bit melancholy, thinking how the neighborhood was progressively older. At that time, they were not incorrect. We rarely saw anyone younger than a teen in the neighborhood. During our first beggar's night, we were still house poor and did not have furni-



ture in the living room. One of our few visitors-- a quick witted teen looked into our empty living room and said, "you gave away your couches for halloween?" Smart alec.

Then we became a part of our street's next baby boom and Halloween got fun. We dressed our two-year old son as "Woody the Cowboy," for his first venture. On our first home visit, the resident answered and our son walked through

the door as if we were going to move in. It took him a number of homes to become familiar with the process, but he was quite good at it, I assure you.

A couple years later, our second child was ready to make a Halloween appearance. She was less than one but we put her in a lady bug suit. She looked cute and had no idea what was happening. We were of course doing the work for her as we pulled the wagon. And held out her bag.

My wife and I would take turns between who would take the kids and who would stay behind to hand out the candy. We'd always save a few extra goodies for the neighbors closest to our area and would mentally check them off as they visited.

There has always been were always particular homes that were must-visits. Pat Holt's house off of Rockwood particularly stood out. It was spectacularly decorated. The Richardsons, and their trash can of terror, was another. The trash can came rigged with an air horn that startled its victims as they approached the house. Most everyone has experienced that first time jolt. Then they would all hang around to see the reaction of the next victim. To this day whenever I hear an air horn, I immediately think of Halloween.

As my children got older, word passed among their friends that Forest Park was a great place to trick or treat. While most of my daughter's friends lived in more affluent neighborhoods where the candy payload was likely higher, they continued to gravitate toward our neighborhood instead. And though they have exceeded trick-or treating age, they still spend beggars night in Forest Park either passing out candy or walking around the neighborhood to experience the fun.

Less than a month away for this year's Halloween...we can't wait!!




