# Make some TI

My fellow residents,

One of the first Latin phrases I learned in high school is "Tempus fugit" which means "Time flies"... Undoubtedly, many of you; like, me are taking stock of the past year and are just as surprised at how many items were on your vision board for 2019 that you simply ran out of time to accomplish. 2020 is already off to a gallop and it is already February! I bring this up because for many of you, it was one of your goals to get more engaged/ involved in our community. You kept telling yourself you will pick up the mantle next month or next week and before you knew it, the year was over and you never got going. Sound familiar?



I would like to take this opportunity to challenge us all to recommit to EACH of us; homeowner or renter, to being one of the many building blocks that make our Forest Park the amazing community it is! What does this recommitment look like you may ask? Well, here are a few suggestions:

**Volunteer:** the Forest Park Civic Association has several committees e.g. Social Activities, Publicity, Forester, and Membership Committees to name a few. Each of these committees is **severely understaffed**. We can do so much more with more hands lightening the load. In a recent survey, over 60% of residents responded that you still prefer to receive a paper copy of our monthly community newsletter. What I find disheartening is that the work to get this paper out to everyone every month is done by less than 1% of all the residents in a community with over 2900 households and is funded only by about 570 of those households...which leads me to my next suggestion.

Pay Your Annual Dues: We are talking about \$25 for the ENTIRE YEAR! That is only \$2.08 per month! This past membership year, I hoped that we could get at least 75% of households paying their membership. We are currently at just about 20% for paid memberships. All we do is driven by our ability to afford it---if we have more paid memberships, it allows us to do more as an organization and even opens the door to discussing ways in which we can make a real difference in our community. I not saying that money is the only way our civic association makes an impact in our community; but it definitely helps! Let's do better in 2020!

Attend Meetings: I am aware that not everyone can attend every single meeting. I am suggesting that you make the effort to attend as many meetings as possible each year. You will never met better neighbors than our regulars. They are amazing

people to get to know, are a wealth of knowledge; yet, most importantly, your fresh perspective is also very important to keep our organization nimble. It also helps to give you a better understanding of how your civic association really works.

Get to know your Area Representative: this starts with getting to know what area of Forest Park you live in. Once that is established, get over to our website <a href="http://www.fpcivic.org">http://www.fpcivic.org</a> and look up your Area Representative. They are your first stop for all your questions, concerns or suggestions; and lastly,

Get Engaged Online: our civic association has a Facebook Page—Forest
Park Civic Association is the name with 387 followers currently—be
sure to follow it. Additionally, we have a resident-driven group which has
over 450 active residents called Forest Park Neighborhood (Columbus,
OH). Be sure to answer the questions in order to be approved to join the
group.

Please stop kicking the bucket down the road and get involved! We need you more than you know. To paraphrase President John F. Kennedy's appeal, ask not what your civic association can do for you; but what you can do for your civic association! I have dropped the proverbial gauntlet at your feet Forest Park...what say you?

## Happenings at Epworth United Methodist Church

Epworth's Angel Giving Tree ministry for 2019 served 63 children in 22 families which we connected through our food pantry and street ministry. Each child received gifts from their wish list sponsored by Epworth's congregation. Our hat and mitten tree was filled to the top and all items of outerwear will be distributed to area schools.

Scout Sunday at Epworth will be held on February 9th during the worship service. It is also the 100th anniversary of the Methodist Church and Boy Scouts of America's starting a formal partnership. Epworth celebrates our shared commitment to grow youth with strong values.

2019 marked 43 years of service for Epworth's Food Pantry. Through November 2019, 492 households were served, representing 1,745 individuals. ## **Tax Time**

It's tax season. And, we get it. No one, except for maybe accountants and tax consultants, looks forward to this time of year.

But there's a free program that can help Central Ohio households make filing their tax returns a lot less stressful. It's called Tax Time, a coalition of nonprofit, business, and government organizations providing free, high-quality tax assistance services to low- and moderate-income households and connecting them to financial education and savings opportunities.

Tax Time works to help qualified individuals and families claim valuable tax deductions and credits and avoid tax preparation fees, with the overall goal of assisting low- and moderateincome households to achieve financial stability.



Every year, Tax Time kicks-off the tax season with their Super Saturday event, being held this year on February 1st from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Columbus Downtown High School. Super



Saturday will also feature a financial resource fair that offers information on savings and checking accounts and benefits-eligibility screenings.

If you earned \$56,000 or less in 2019, you may qualify for Tax Time's free tax preparation services. Call 211 to see if you're eligible and schedule an appointment. Walk-ins are also welcome.



## Forest Park Civic Association Meeting Minutes Tuesday, January 14, 2020 Epworth United Methodist Church

Meeting was called to order and Pledge of Allegiance done by President Felix Quachey at 7:02 pm Roll Call was taken by Mike Stone of Board Members and Area Reps

#### **President comments**: 2 items:

The husband of the Pastor of Epworth United Methodist passed away suddenly in the past week and Felix wanted the FPCA Board to be aware and to see what we can do for her and the church. We were told by a neighbor that funeral was several days ago but Felix commented FPCA would still look at doing something.

Felix also reported that the Laughlins have agreed to help out with part of the process that is the Forester Delivery and Stuffing Days. He still would like to get another person to help out so that they are not overwhelmed with any of the work that may occur.

Feburary Guest for the FPCA meeting on February 11th will be a representative of the Franklin County Clerk of Courts.

Member question about status of the Welcome Committee. Felix said that Mike Stone was actively working on it and will update the group during committee reports.

Swearing in of 2020 Officers and Area Reps for the Forest Park Civic Association. Officer Clinger of the Columbus Police Department swore in the those Board members and Area Reps with an oath to serve FPCA for the 2020 year.

New business: Treasurer Dan Hartzel informed the group that it is time to conduct a budget meeting and that any and all are welcome. He wants folks to contact him and once he has a date selected for the meeting he would notify all board members and other people who were interested in attending this meeting. The group stated the meeting would probably be before the end of January 2020.

<u>Committee Reports:</u> Felix reminded committee leaders to not be afraid to reach out or contact folks for help on their activities. He doesn't want neighbors to feel like they have to conduct their responsibilities on their own and that there are plenty of great Forest Park neighbors who can help. Before committee reports President Felix introduced Alicia Ward, NCC President, who is now a returning neighbor in Forest Park with her husband Russ. Alicia spoke of her role with Northland Community Council and also her involvement with Elevate Northland.

## <u>Treasurer Report:</u> given by Dan Hartzel, FPCA Treasurer

Copies of the December Treasurer report were handed out. 3 new memberships were collected, we are still ahead of budget by 51%, balance is at \$25,064.10. Motion made, 2nd and passed to accept December report
