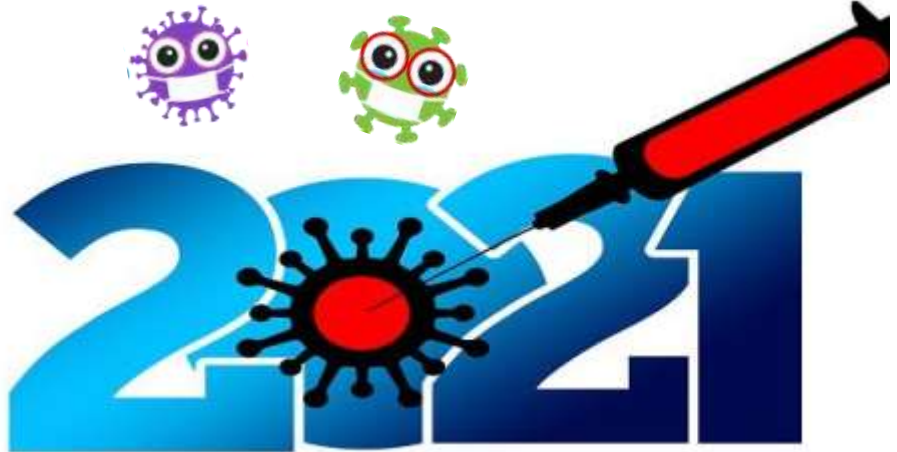

Hello Forest Park! Happy New Year! 2020 was quite the unprecedented year but with it brought a greater sense of community. There have been several posts on social media of folks sharing extra food, lending a helping hand, and warning each other of potentially dangerous situations. Neighbors are looking out for neighbors, becoming friends and strengthening friendships. While reporting crime in the area to people living in the area is great, we'd be remiss not to provide a few reminders. If you are a victim of or a witness to a crime in the neighborhood, please contact the Columbus Police Department at 614-645-4545 (for non-emergencies) or 911 (for emergencies). If

you have questions or would like to report a code violation (long grass, abandoned vehicles, bulk trash, etc.), please contact 311. If you would like to find out more information about the Forest Park Civic Association or are wondering how you can get involved, contact your area rep or another member of the Forest Park Civic Board found inside the directory included with every issue of the Forester.

We'd also like to remind you to keep your car doors locked at all times and to avoid keeping valuables in your car. We've seen several reports of cars being stolen at gas stations in the area but, while it's infuriating, the only actions we can control are our own. Please remember that it only takes a moment of distraction for something bad to happen and the harder we make it for criminals, the less likely they're going to want to try to target our area.

## Another Great Original Resident of Forest Park Betty Griffeth May 24, 1929-December 10, 2020

Betty was the force behind the founding of the Forest Park Civic Association. She was the "John Adams" of our formation. One could say without Betty's drive to create a welcoming, family supportive neighborhood we would not have a lot of what we have.

The Griffeths, Betty and Dick, married for 61 years, were what we called one of "the first homesteaders." They were the first residents on the second street, Hazelwood, built in Forest Park. It was part of the first parade of homes. As the community filled in, mostly with young families with lots of kids, Betty started to work. "We wanted it to be a comfortable place to raise your children." "We wanted to protect our investments." "We wanted to live up to the name, "Forest Park."



No one in the group had ever started a civic association before. Betty went over to Worthington to one of their meetings. She came back with a copy of their constitution and by-laws. That was the model. Betty told how she and the group of 8 went to meet with the Metzger brothers, our developers. She asked for their help to organize. She recalled the attorney warning the Metzgers, "don't do it. They will pester you into doing things you do not want to do." "They helped and we pestered," Betty shared with a grin.

We have two car garages so everyone can get in and out of their car in comfort and to make Forest Park look like a neighborhood and not a parking lot. We have less density on many of our streets which means larger yards. The first traffic light at Karl and Morse was a result of petitioning the city. We have a bowling alley at Forest Park Plaza due to this founding group.

Working with the Metzger Brothers Forest Park was designed to be a self-contained neighborhood with grocers, pharmacies, swimming pools, park area, salons, restaurants, hardware stores, etc. in the East, Tamarack Circle and the West, The Plaza. This became a model for hundreds of communities throughout the US.

She was instrumental for the variety of social activities. There was a holiday ball every year with dressing to the nines, great meals, and dancing with nearly 200 people. There was not only a Fourth of July parade, but a Christmas parade. Each street competed in float building contests. The Fourth of July parade ended at Forest Park Plaza with a large cook out. "We talked the Metzgers into putting on a fireworks display." Betty beamed. "We didn't want a little effort. The Metzgers did not disappoint."



It would take pages to pay full tribute to all Betty and her crew did. The location of the schools, the apartment restrictions, beautification efforts, the islands on Sandalwood, the YMCA, the layout of the streets, security, The Forester, building the baseball field at Woodward Park, starting a little league, etc. were all done under these founders guiding hands.

Betty joyously told us about the first days and the building. She had stories about kids ice skating down what is now Karl Road. The many petition drives and visits to city council could fill a file cabinet.

I first met Betty when we were putting together the FPCA 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. At 83 Betty was as sharp as ever remembering every name and amazing with the details. Betty was always working to make Forest Park a better place to live.

## The Forest Park Gardener

I have a dear friend who just recently has gotten into gardening.

Like the rest of us, she was wondering what she could do over the winter, to have something growing that can offer a little bloom and cheer in the heavy winter months of January/February. I gave her an Amaryllis bulb.

Many of us experienced gardeners have brought in our tropical plants, and have them under grow lights, in the basement (like my lemon tree), or taking up all the sun in our South Windows. An Amaryllis, can bloom anywhere. Once the bulb gets going, you can put it anywhere. I think of it as the "Jiffy Pop" of indoor gardening.

If you are interested, Home Depot, and the nursery stores will have the bulbs on sale, some of which may have already started to grow. Planting the bulb is easy, you put it in a pot, covering it with soil leaving about ½ of the bulb above the soil line. Keep the soil moist, and provide, bright, but indirect light. Remember – MOIST – not wet. Too much water equals ROT. You can put a couple of ice cubes near the bulb and just let them melt.

If you have kids, you can make this a great science project. Daily measurement of the stalk, how many days till bloom, etc. Amaryllis (Hippeastrum) are native to South America, and come in so many varieties and colors. They bloom in about 8 weeks, just about when you are ready to ditch your Poinsettias. Once the flowers fade, you can cut the flower stem above the bulb. You can continue to water (remember moist not wet) the bulbs, and in the spring, after May 15<sup>th</sup>, you can put them in your garden outside (partial shade – protect from really hot sun).

In the fall, when the leaves begin to turn yellow, cut them off about 2 inches above the bulb, and remove it from the soil (just like begonia and canna bulbs). Put them in a paper bag in a cool environment (basement or crawl space) for 8 weeks. Try to shoot for 45°.

If you pull them out of the ground in late October, you are ready to plant them again in December!

One thing – if you decide to keep them in a refrigerator, don't store them next to apples. Apples give off ethylene gas, which will sterilize the bulbs. Some plants just don't get along with others!

I hope you try one, if you haven't done so. They do not give off heavy scent, so people with allergies tend to tolerate these, over paper whites or other really fragrant bulbs.

If you need a break from the winter weather, please visit our Franklin Park Conservatory. You can be careful and socially distance, while enjoying the living environment.
