

Treasuer's Update August, 2022

We received 187 household memberships. This also includes one generous person who has paid the membership fee for someone who couldn't afford to join. We appreciate your generosity! Of the households paying through PayPal, 17 chose to include the PayPal fee in their support. Because of them, we saved \$23.32 in PayPal fees!

Our members continued supporting our three main areas - \$673.33 to Security, \$378.33 towards Beautification and \$263.33 towards the Forester.

Advertising revenue was \$620.

Our main expenses for the month were our security patrols for \$756.25, repairs to the Island signs for \$150 (with thanks to Patrick for donating his labor!), advertising for the Garage sale of \$52.42, and one returned check fee of \$15.

We are just about 60% to meeting our membership budget goal of \$14,000, so please continue to encourage your neighbors to join!

There was one correction to the June report. I had listed both our NCC membership fee of \$170 and the banquet tickets of \$151 under NCC. I have since broken those out into their respective categories.

Looking for something different and fun to do with the family after LABOR DAY? The Columbus Garden Railway Society (CGRS) is having our 2022 Fall Garden Tour **Sunday, September 11th, from 1-5pm**. Rain (bring an umbrella) or shine the tour is on! *Masks are optional for entry* based on your comfort level and we will still follow social distancing guidelines. At press time there are currently eighteen garden railways open for your enjoyment.

The closest site for our neighborhood is our Forest Park Garden RR in Forest Park West on **Lindenwood Rd**. The next closest would be The Crawford Valley RR and one on Norma in Columbus, along with the Sweet Hollow RR and the Hacker Express RR in Westerville. Others on the tour this year are in Minerva Park, Upper Arlington, Dublin, Marysville, Johnstown and Mt Sterling. Membership in the Columbus Garden Railway Society (CGRS) is open to anyone. While the name of the organization refers to garden railroading, ownership of a garden railroad is not necessary. The Columbus Garden Railway Society (CGRS) is a unique, organization whose goals are to have fun with garden railroading and the sharing information on the hobby. The group is simply an informal gathering of people interested in gardening and railroading. We all subscribe the 10- foot rule, which loosely translates to "If it looks good from 10 feet away, then it is good enough". Membership in the Columbus Garden Railway Society (CGRS) is open to anyone. While the name of the organization refers to garden railroading, ownership of a garden railroad is not necessary. Many of our members have a G-scale railroad in their garden or yard, others may have one in their basement or other room of their home, and yet others may choose to not have one at all. That is not important. What is important is that all of our members share a common interest and love of our hobbies.

Hello Forest Park!

We have received reports of residents' houses being hit with BBs & paintballs. Whether intentional or not, please remember that no firearms (including airsoft, BB, pellet, paintball, arrows) should ever be discharged without practicing gun safety and with a full understanding of where the projectile will end up.

As summer starts winding down, days get shorter and kids start settling back into their school routines, we wanted to take the opportunity to send out a reminder of local resources.

311: used to arrange bulk pickup or report any code violations around the neighborhood. Check 311's website to see items that qualify for bulk pickup or to arrange a time and before reporting your neighbor's long grass, start with a friendly conversation.

614-645-4545: this is the non-emergency police phone number. You can use this if you see suspicious activity, have a car broken into, want to make a police report, or simply have questions. Emergencies, like gun fire, should prompt you to call 911.

<u>Dyandrich@columbuspolice.org</u>: Officer Dan Yandrich is our police liaison and can be contacted directly if you have any questions or want to follow up on a specific issue around the neighborhood.

The Forest Park Gardener – September

I am ready to say goodbye to this summer season, as a gardener. I cannot remember a summer that just seemed so brutal. We were either experiencing a monsoon, or an extended long, dry period. It seemed like it got hot in June – and stayed that way through mid-August.



Of course I'm not ready for the cold weather, but I'm starting to put my garden to bed early this year.. Many of my favorite plants have either gone dormant (ie – dead) or have barely survived. This is what I have noticed in the garden:

- The number of butterflies (Monarch/Swallowtail) are way down. I didn't get any eggs on my Milkweed or Parsley/Dill, so no caterpillars.... That is something new this year.
- Marigolds and Zinnias did very well. Herbs like Basil, Rosemary, and Thyme did great, and I have lots of dried herbs for the winter. They all took the heat and dry weather like champs. I just didn't plant enough of them!
- The hardy hibiscus I planted last year did very well. Full morning sun and afternoon shade
- I saw one hummingbird this year and it has only been in the last week or so, my guess is it is starting its migration.
- This was not a good year to put new shrubs in the yard. I spent a lot of water \$\$ and they still died. (I don't normally use potable city water for my garden, but this year was an exception)

I was also watching what plants the pollinators, that made it into my garden, preferred. It was interesting to note that they appear to ignore the more colorful varieties of Cornflower and favored the native variety. I started reading and there is research out there that shows that all the newer varieties of flowering plants are not attractive to pollinators – even though we think they are great.

And so, with that, I'm going to make some changes for next year. I am going to embrace the fact that my front yard is full bore sun. When you walk by, you might now see more herbs and tomatoes in the front bed among the day lilies. I am going to plant drought resistant varieties and focus more on native plant species.

Just someone remind me of this in the Spring because I'm sure it will be forgotten by then. Hope Springs Eternal. – Lisa Dove – ForestParkGardener@gmail.com

Great Service on Trash bin repair from Columbusand it's FREE

Peggy, my wife, retrieved our trash bin on Monday. A wheel had come off. Makes it a little tougher to get to the back of the house.

We called **614-645-3111**, the city hot line. We followed the prompts. A very respectful and efficient person took care of us. "The wheel came off," I said. "The trash bin," she completed my sentence. "We can take care of that."

She went trough a list of questions securing our location. We were told to leave the bin out at the curb on our pickup days until 4 pm. It would be taken care of in three or four weeks. I trust them because they have repaired it before, twice actually. Once for wheels and once for the lid.

The past repairs were handled with the same easy phone call. Get on the schedule and leave the bin at the curb until 4pm. Always taken care of.

I wondered if everyone knows how easy it is. As one drives through the Forest Park neighborhood one can see several broken trash bins, usually lids. They are that way for months. Do they know that one simple phone call can take care of it.

And it is FREE. They even replace a bin for us for FREE. The broken lid one.

We have received stellar service on bulk pickup as well. You do not need to have old furniture, mattresses or household items lay around in your yard, garage, or basement. Call **641-645-3111** follow the same easy procedure. Tell them what you have. They will tell you the few items they will not take such as construction waste or tires. They give you a date for the pickup. It usually the same as your trach pickup, but not always. And usually over a week out. You need to put the stuff out at the curb the night before. Please do not put it out sooner. It looks terrible. Sometimes the pile gets spread by vermin. I think we all want the neighborhood to look its best.

Since we are talking trash. I saw a special on recycling. One story told how putting the wrong stuff in the recycle bin cost the recycling company. Plastic bags are the worst. They clog the machine and shut things down. Very difficult to clean.

People take care to collect recycle material and then defeat the purpose by putting it in a plastic trash bag. It cost something it the neighborhood of a million dollars per year to clean out the unrecyclable material. This is money the city can use on other stuff that we are complaining the city does not do.

No food garbage in recycle.

A couple times a year I clean my trash bins. I do not like the smell, but it helps to get it done.

A story on the news showed a woman in Columbus who has invented a trash bin cleaner. She retrofitted a truck with a grabber that picks up the bin. There is a neat looking sprayer that gyrates in every direction. Great idea for folks who do not want to delve into the trash bin.
