Ohio School Bus Laws


When a school bus is stopped on a roadway to pick up or drop off passengers, the following regulations apply to other drivers on the roadway.

- 1. When a school bus driver is preparing to stop the bus, he or she activates four amber lights two on the front and two on the rear of the bus. These lights continue to flash until the bus is fully stopped. Other vehicles are not required to stop during this preliminary stage of the eight -light warning but should prepare to stop as soon as the bus comes to a full stop. When the bus comes to a complete stop, the amber lights stop flashing and **four red lights** two in the front and two in the back start flashing while the children enter or leave the bus. In addition, a stop arm with flashing red lights is automatically extended beneath the window on the left side of the bus.
- 2. If the bus is stopped on a street or road which has **fewer than four lanes**, all traffic approaching the bus from either direction **must stop** at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.
- 3. If the bus is stopped on a street or road which has **four or more lanes**, **only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.**

- 1. We are about halfway to meeting our overall budget of \$27,589, with \$17,601 received. In the month of August, we received 44 household memberships thank you!! We have met and exceeded our income budget for Beautification and the Forester, and we are about halfway to meeting our advertising goal. Between those two goals, we fund about 80% of the cost of the Forester. For Security, we've budgeted \$2,000 in additional contributions, to fund about 20% of the anticipated cost. We are very close to meeting this goal! My big concern is we have received no business memberships since this budget year began, and we haven't really received any since February. We trust that the team continues to work on our local businesses.
- 2. In terms of expenses, all the PayPal fees were covered by our members this month thank you all! We're about half way on the cost of Foresters, and Rita purchased enough bags to last through February of next year. The total cost of our parade (float + bikes and trikes) did exceed the budget, but not significantly. The big categories that have had no, or very minimal expenses are our social committee, and the Island Maintenance. I do see the islands being mowed, but I have received no invoices for that cost. The \$150 spent to date merely includes the cost to repair the

sign boxes.

• The Committee approved (16-0 w/ 2 abstentions) a motion (by FPCA, second by WRA) to RECOMMEND DISAPPROVAL of the application.

Rules of the Road,

Info taken from the OHIO Laws & Administrative Rules

Rule 3335-21-12, Emergency and Public Safety Vehicles https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-administrative-code/rule-3335-21-12





(1) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized emergency vehicle or public safety vehicle making use of audible and visual signals meeting the requirements of these regulations and/or state law, the driver of every other vehicle shall yield the right of way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right edge or curb of the street or roadway, clear of any intersection, and shall stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer, hospital and campus security officer or traffic control officer.

Quick Tips to Ensure Your Safety

- Listen and stay alert: Remain focused on the road at all times by not engaging in distracted driving. Use your mirrors to view oncoming vehicles.
- **Proceed with caution:** Pull to the right side of the road and do so swiftly, but cautiously.
- Resume entry slowly: Use your turn signal! Slowly merge back onto the road or highway while checking your surroundings for others.

Across Columbus, you can see the difference between neighborhoods that have an active civic association and those that do not. We are not a homeowner's association. We do not enforce neighborhood rules. We are a civic association that works to benefit all Forest Park residents.

Membership in the FPCA is only \$25 per household. The FPCA is entirely run by volunteers who are residents just like you. That means every dollar is used to directly benefit our neighborhood.

We are dedicated to transparency and publish our Treasurer's Report every month in this newsletter. Our volunteer treasurer also provides an update at every FPCA monthly meeting (I invite you to join us for our October meeting).

What do you get for your annual membership contribution? Some benefits are obvious because you see them every day.

Benefits that you see:

- We pay to maintain the landscaped islands at the Satinwood Pl. entrances at Karl Rd.
- We recently paid to replace all Welcome to Forest Park signs at all entrances to Forest Park East and West.

Every FPCA member can request free home checks with the form in each Forester newsletter, at www.fpcivic.org or by emailing our volunteer Supplemental Security Coordinator Daryl Van Mercetta at dvanmercetta@gmail.com.
- We pay for the welcome folders and printed materials that we drop off to new residents who just moved into our neighborhood. These packets include information about Forest Park, maps of the streets, nearby businesses, voter registration information, and other helpful items to make our new neighbors feel at home.
- We pay for programs that recognize neighbors for their beautification efforts in the annual Beautification Contest, rewarding our neighbors who enrich our streets with improvements.
- We pay for supplies to build our float for the Northland Fourth of July Parade.
- We pay for awards for kids who decorate their bikes and trikes in the Fourth of July Parade.
- We pay for printing and postage to mail our annual Membership Packet to nearly 3,000 households, encouraging residents to join the FPCA.
- We pay for advertising to promote two Community Garage Sales each year, attracting buyers from around Central Ohio.
- We pay to design and print the Forest Park Directory, which is updated every several years and delivered to all member households.
- We typically pay for neighborhood social events, including the Easter Egg Hunt, Block Parties, and the Halloween Party. These events were cancelled during the pandemic, and we plan to revive them in 2023.

Some benefits are not obvious but are just as important

We pay dues to the Northland Community Council. The NCC is a critical organization that represents 26 area civic associations and organizations in the Northland area. The NCC represents more than 100,000 households and ensures that the City of Columbus recognizes Northland as an important political voice. Two FPCA volunteers currently serve on the commission and provide detailed reports at every FPCA meeting. The NCC is our most effective connection to the City of Columbus and makes recommendations to the city on behalf of Forest Park residents.

Among many other services, the NCC protects us from many development and zoning plans that would harm our neighborhoods and maintains a direct two-way channel to city officials.

We pay for insurance that is required for our non-profit organization.

We pay for a P.O. Box and office supplies that are necessary to conduct our operations.

We pay for payment processing fees that are necessary for online membership payments.

The Forest Park Gardener – October 2022

October is the beginning of our Fall and Winter Season. It is the last month of Daylight Savings Time, as we have been losing daylight time every day. Early in November, we get the reap the harvest of an extra hour of sleep.

We can blame (or praise) Benjamin Franklin for Daylight Savings Time. In 1784 he proposed the idea as a way maximize the use of sunlight longer into the evening. His reason was that households could burn fewer candles in the mornings and evenings

during the winter. However, the practice did not become "official" until passed by Congress 1966 (Uniform Time Act). For those of us who have made drip candles and know the time and effort it takes to make them, I can understand where folks in the 18th century probably thought this was a good idea.

In the garden, we are beginning to see the effects of the lessening daylight hours. Our flowers and trees begin to produce less and less chlorophyll (the green stuff) and begin to decline. Trees begin to show their true colors, as the chlorophyll diminishes, and their colored leaves appear. Birds are beginning to cluster for migration, and we still see some hummers passing through our area. This year was a slight year for Monarchs and other butterflies, but I've seen some lately on my Butterfly bushes.

Sometimes in October, after a cool, wet spring, we begin to see an awful lot of fungus/mildew on our perennials and shrubs. This year was a particular disaster for older Lilac varieties.

Does your lilac looks like it is dying? Are your Peonies covered in moldy powder? You are not alone. I have had a couple of inquiries regarding old Lilacs that appear to be losing all their leaves and just looking really ragged. Our cool, wet spring provided our soil with the right environment to allow fungus to grow and hide out all summer, until the days grew cooler. Resist the urge to get out the chain saw! Right now, you need to make sure that all leaf litter is cleared away so that the fungus is not retained in the soil.

(HINT: Use our city recycle service, and don't put the leaves in your compost bin, unless you are sure that your bin's temperature is sufficient to kill the fungus)

In the spring, when the shrub buds out, you can decide to spray it with a copper based fungicide. I'm going to let mine bloom (or hope it does) and then I'm going to also thin it out and prune it down. Increased air circulation during the spring should help.

October is also the time to plant/divide perennials and shrubs. New plantings must have time to establish before the winter. Evergreens should be given plenty of water. Mums are popular for planting now, and with heavy mulching can survive to next spring. If they return, keep them pinched to an inch until 4th of July, and you can have beautiful mums again in the fall.

According to my calendar, the cicadas in July predict a first Frost Date of October 7th. Time to grab the Farmer's Almanac and see what we have in store for winter.
