# Happy 2023 but it starts with Budget Cuts

Happy New Year to all the residents of Forest Park. In mid-December I had a meeting with the Treasurer concerning the budget of the Forest Park Civic Association. It was determined that there will be a short fall in the monies required to meet our budget expectations through the budget year which ends in April, 2023.

On December 21, 2022 there was a meeting of the executive board to address this problem. In attendance were the president, Ed Vanasdale, the treasurer, Cheryl Lutman, the secretary, Lou Bernard, the supplemental security chair, Daryl Van Mercetta, the public relations chair, Mary Squerra and Forester Editor, Rita Woeste. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm at the president's house. There is a \$4,633 budget deficit for the rest of the fiscal year which ends in April 30, 2023. This has occurred because of a short fall of expected paid household memberships and the very few business memberships secured for the 2022 fiscal year.

The largest portion of the budget is allocated to the printing of the Forester and to supplemental security patrols. It was decided that cuts to these two major expenditures would have to be adjusted. The security patrols will be reduced each week, and if memberships don't increase, further reductions will occur in April. This will leave \$2700 through April of 2023. The Forester will, also, sustain some changes. The February and possibly April issue will be on-line only. The March issue will be printed and delivered as usual. This will save \$1970 through April. These cuts will leave a surplus of \$37 in our treasury. It is the goal of our association to remain within the budget set for the year. Mary Squerra has offered to work on securing funding for the Forester to be printed and delivered in April which is approximately \$1000. I am sorry that these cuts have to be done, but we must maintain a balanced budget. If additional funding becomes available then the services will be reinstated. More Household memberships will help us balance our budget. Encourage you neighbors to become paid members of the Forest Park Civic Association. Thank you for your understanding for the need to do this.

The hotel owner of the property of 1289 E. Dublin-Granville Road next to Popeyes restaurant will be at our January meeting, Tuesday January 10, to discuss turning the hotel into a residential property. Residents of Forest Park will be allowed to hear his proposal and ask questions concerning it. Please be in attendance for this meeting as it greatly affects our neighborhood. In addition to the Forest Park residents members from Devonshire and Sharon Woods communities are invited to be in attendance.

The election of the officers for our civic association will be held in February since the January meeting will be taken up with the property discussion.

#### **Hello Forest Park!**

Unfortunately, due to the decline of Forest Park Civic Association memberships, the Board has decided to decrease the number of supplemental security patrols in our area. The security company *will still be patrolling*, just not as frequently as they have in the past. If you want this to change, please encourage your neighbors to join the civic association, which is only \$25.00 per year for the entire household! It's the right thing to do.





Fortunately, even though patrols will be declining, there is still a lot that we can do as a neighborhood to keep our area safe. The simplest, and admittedly most fun, is to get out there and meet your neighbors! Make friends with the people living on your streets and start looking out for each other. Learning what cars and people to expect on your street can make suspicious activity more apparent. When you do notice something amiss, reach out to your neighbor and the police, if necessary, at 614-645-4545. Also, keep your porch lights on in the evening, lock your car doors, don't leave valuables in your vehicle, and turn on your alarm system while you're away.

#### Northland Community Counsel, January 2023 Meeting

#### **Community Engagement**

There were a number of local representatives not present in this months NCC meeting, however, Assistant City Attorney Sarah Pomeroy was in attendance and discussed two local objections to hotels that were cited for violation. Overall, she stated that calls for violations were low at this point but there are a number of the local hotels in the court system for violations.

Information from Consider Biking was presented and detailed upcoming trials being developed across multiple parks in our areas, keep an eye out for new trails!

The Northland Area Business Association announced a new representative for the NCC meetings, retiring Dave Cooper from 20+ years of service on the counsel. A sincere thank you was given to Dave for his efforts over the years. They also received a number of grants for 161 task force \$25k with

up to matching of \$25k for beautification. Also received 10k in additional beautification funds. City report that counsel will be meeting again starting next week to resume business for the 2023 year. The process for replacing Elizabeth Brown's seat has begun.

#### **Round Table discussion**

The evenings conversation was around housing in Northland and the Community Shelter Board was present to talk about and educate on what they do and what to expect in Northland. The Community Shelter Board has been in service for 35 years. Currently they have 20 agency partners that are funded by them to help prevent homelessness, emergency shelters, supportive housing, etc. Their strategic plan has 9 focus areas for the upcoming few years and they are excited about this direction they are taking to help combat homelessness.

Currently 63% of rental households state they are at risk of eviction in the next two months. Rent is rising at twice the rate of income. Because the average stay for a family in a shelter has increased over the past few years the cost for rehousing those individuals have doubled for agencies providing the rehousing services. Homeless hotline has been effective to prevent homelessness from happening. Prevention services have 91% rate of success. Last year they also helped 200 people that lived directly on the streets and 7,200 hundred people have been served last year in total.

Rapid rehousing solutions have impacted 760 households. Permanent supportive housing is serving 2,294 households which is housing plus case management and other wrap around services. Two criteria to qualify for this. Medical claim or disability or number of days living on streets or homeless.

Currently there are 70 people living at the 1111 Mediterranean Ave location which is permanent supportive housing. Those are leased apartments with rent subsidies and can receive services on site for long term positive outcomes. It can be forever housing or it can lead to alternative housing outcomes as they regain their independence from housing assistance. More conversation about upcoming housing solution will be had at the Next Forest Park Civic Association Meeting on Tuesday, January 10<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at the Epworth Methodist Church.

The rest of the meeting conducted normal business. Minutes from November meeting were approved and December will be sent out. All other reports were presented and approved. The next meeting is Tuesday, February 7<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.



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#### **Renew Your Commitment to Recycling!**

Franklin County's diversion rate stands at 51% - higher than the national average! Residents are recycling more than ever and America Recycles Day (Nov. 15) is a perfect time to renew that commitment to waste diversion. This nationally recognized holiday, established by Keep America Beautiful, serves as an annual reminder to commit to and improve recycling around the country. At SWACO, our goal is to ensure that people not only recycle but that they recycle right. By taking a few minutes to recycle the right way, you help reduce pollution, contribute to cleaner water, conserve limited natural resources, support our economy and reduce central Ohio's reliance on landfills.

Knowing what is and isn't recyclable isn't always obvious, so we're sharing some of our favorite recycling tips as you enter the busy holiday season where entertaining is the name of the game:

#### 'Tis the Season for Oils:

Are you planning to deep fry your Thanksgiving turkey? If you do, bring the leftover fryer oil in a sealed container to our Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHW), located at 645 E. 8th Avenue in Columbus, and we will help you dispose of it safely. Hours and location details are available at www.swaco.org/hhw.

#### Know Where to Throw:

If you've ever thrown a party, you've likely been overwhelmed with questions like, "Do you recycle?" or "Where should I recycle this?" when guests need to dispose of their trash. Make it easy on them by keeping your recycling container in a highly visible location. Consider also attaching a sign that shows guests what should be recycled, and what should be put in the trash.

#### Cups are a go!

Earlier this year, Franklin County's recycling program was expanded to accept disposable paper, plastic and aluminum cups for recycling. Be sure to remove any straws and ensure they're free of any liquids before recycling. (Unfortunately, Red Solo cups – a staple at many holiday parties – are still off-limits for recycling!)

#### Bag the bags:

One in four homes in Franklin County still bag recyclables. When materials are bagged, they don't always get recycled. Don't let your efforts go to waste. Keep recyclables loose in your cart; don't bag them.
