Northland Community Council Report

The Northland Community Council met at Westerwood on May 2. Our police liaisons noted that National Night Out is August 2. CPD is working on a campaign against Street Racing. If you see racers gathering, let CPD now right away. The impound lot is

full (see recent news reports), but they ask that we keep reporting abandoned cars. Our City Zone Attorney is working on a number of cases, including hotel license renewals. In our area, the Doll House remains closed, while the case of the car lot on Tamarack Circle will be heard in August. Our FACT/ Consider Biking reporter noted that May is Bike Month. More sidewalks and bike paths are being added in Northland. The Karl Rd. Branch of the library notes that the Summer Reading Program will begin on June 3. They will host the Columbus Book Festival on July 15 and 16. We had a visit from the Zoning Department. They are working on updating zoning in Columbus, and are proposing a simplification of the code. This is very important to our community as one of the areas they are focusing on is Morse Road. One of the focuses is making it easier to zone for affordable multiunit housing. They want community input.

I encourage all residents to check this site out and get involved. The NCC Banquet went well, and a number of community volunteers were honored, including our own Bob Hinebaugh and Ernie Mack. Next up for our community is the Northland Fourth of July Parade. Planning meetings are the 3rd Saturday of the month at Epworth. Finally, next month's NCC meeting will be at Westerwood at 7 pm on June 6. The public is welcome to attend.



Hello Forest Park!

Fourth of July is around the corner which means that it's officially firework season. Please be kind to your neighbors and mindful of the community when setting off fireworks. Safety is key and a lot of animals, veterans, and kids are sensitive to the sounds that fireworks make. If you hear something that can either be a firework or gunfire, err on the side of caution and contact the Columbus City Police. The non-emergency number is 614-645-4545. To bypass the computer prompts, hit the star key (*) to be taken directly to an



operator.

Please also use the non-emergency number to contact the police if you see signs of street racing or people gathering in the parks after hours. There have been recent reports of drugs, alcohol, and gun activity in the area.

The City of Columbus is still not towing vehicles, however, to report an abandoned vehicle or a commercial truck parked on city streets, you can still contact 311 to report the alleged violation. 311 can also be used to report tall grass, schedule bulk pickup, report a dead city tree, and several other things.

We've been hearing complaints about mail being stolen from the blue mailbox outside of the post office so if you're dropping something off, take the extra time to walk it inside – it will even get you some extra steps on your Fitbit. Also, please remember that we are neighbors and are responsible for creating the type of community we want to live in. Please be kind to each other, look out for

each other, and have each other's back. Forest Park is a great place to live but can only be measured by the merits of the residents so let's work together to keep it safe, clean, and friendly.

Remember, if you're a paid member of the Forest Park Civic Association (only

June – 2023 – Forest Park Gardener

For gardeners, the month of May feels like the start of the NYC marathon. We are leaning forward at the starting line, but the gun hasn't gone off and we are waiting...waiting, and then BANG! We are off and running!

Some of us succumbed to the heat wave at the end of April and bought our annuals and hanging baskets, only to have to bring them all into the garage or basement. Me included. Who can resist the urge to purchase pristine flats of perfect petunias? I certainly can't. We use Mother's day as our benchmark, but sometimes, you just want to get ahead

Johnny Carson always shared a top 10 list after his nightly monologue. (Hint: if you don't know who Johnny Carson is – because you are too young – check out Hulu...He was on the *Tonight Show* way before Jimmy Fallon)

So, here is the top 10 Common pitfalls that gardeners fall into, when we get Spring Fever. (In no particular order)

Planting your plant at the wrong height (too deep or too shallow) In general, whether it is a tree, shrub, or single flower, you should plant everything at the same level as the base of your item. Remember that you should add 1" of mulch as well.

Location, Location, Location – resist the urge to put a shade loving plant in a sunny space. If you have a little tree sapling, that will grow to be about 50 feet.

little tree sapling, that will grow to be about 50 feet, don't put it next to your drainage tile, or in front of your picture window.

Improper watering – Your hand is the best measuring device – dig a bit into the soil, if dry, time to water. Over watering can encourage disease, and slugs. Under watering – stunted growth and imminent demise. For goodness' sake – water a plant at its feet, not on the leaves!

Pruning trees/shrubs at the wrong time. This is very common. A general rule: if it blooms in the spring – prune after it blooms. If it is a summer or late summer bloomer – prune in early spring while still dormant. This does not apply to Fruit trees and shrubs! You don't want to prune after it blooms and cut off all your blueberries! READ YOUR LABELS!

Spacing. Just like children, plants need appropriate space to grow. There is a reason why labels give you information about height and width of the adult plant. If you are planting in a planter, remember the rules of 3 – *Thrill* (tall in the middle) *Fill* (smaller plants in a circle around the center) and *Spill* (plants that hang over the edge of the pot)

Mower setting is too short. In the spring when you can literally watch your grass growing front of you, the temptation is to cut it short. Stop. Whatever the weather, you should cut no more than 1/3 the length of the grass, to prevent burn out, bald spots, and weeds. The longer grass shelters the roots, which gives you stronger turf.

Knowing the difference between annuals and perennials. Annuals complete their life cycle in one season in our growing area. Perennials return year after year, with the crown of the plant staying alive, but dormant, through the winter months.

Bulbs – planting too deep OR planting the bulb upside down. Planting too deep – bulb will not germinate properly. Too Shallow? If it is a Tulip – you just gave the squirrels a free meal. When planting bulbs – look for the round circle with little hairy things. That is the bottom.

Evergreen vs Deciduous Trees/Shrubs. Evergreen – keep their green needles/leaves all times. Deciduous – lose their leaves in the fall/winter, New growth in the spring. If you are looking for a privacy hedge or screen for your window, this is important information!

Impulse buying. My #1 problem. I see a plant or shrub, and I say "I'll find a place for it". Having a general plan for your garden is a good idea, but there is always room for something interesting. Also understanding that if you buy a plant that thrives in Zone 8, you are going to have to bring it in over the winter.





Curious about Compost? Join the Compost Exchange

This month during our FPCA meeting, Ray, from the Compost Exchange, shared how easy it is to start composting. When you're cooking at home it's simple to separate your food scraps from other waste and start a home compost pile. The key to a healthy compost is the right balance of green matter (like fruit peels and

grass clippings) and brown matter (such as dried leaves and coffee grounds). Turn the pile regularly, keeping it moist but not too wet. After your compost breaks down, you'll have nutrient dense matter to spread throughout your garden!

If you're ready to try composting but don't want to do it at home, consider joining The Compost Exchange, a program that makes



and affordable. For \$6 a month, each member will receive a yellow five-gallon bucket and compostable liner to fill with their food scraps. A designated Hub Captain in Forest Park will have a 45 gallon can where residents can conveniently drop their food scraps each week. In exchange, after contributing compost for six months, you can request seven pounds of EPA certified compost. It's that simple!
