#### Forest Park Block Watch program returns with updates from police liaison. Photo Cutline: Officer Dan Yandrich, our Columbus Police Liaison, FPCA President Ed Vanasdale, and FPCA Supplemental Security Coordinator Daryl Van Mercetta at June's Block Watch meeting.

The Forest Park Civic Association's executive committee revived the community Block Watch program on June 13 with a 30-minute public meeting. FPCA president Ed Vanasdale introduced Officer Dan Yandrich, Northland's Columbus Police Liaison. Officer Yandrich gave away free keychain flashlights and children's comic books before providing a summary of recent law enforcement actions and crime prevention tips.

Officer Yandrich reviewed recent notable crimes in the area and told the crowd at the meeting that crime in the community is relatively low compared to other areas. "For as big as Forest Park is, it's really not that bad," he said. He added that the biggest issues for police are stolen vehicles in area apartment complexes.

He said residents have requested more police visibility in the Tamarack Circle area to deter crime and anticipated more frequent patrols. He advised residents concerned about speeding on their streets to contact 311 and request police motorcycle speed monitors.



Yandrich urged residents to get to know their neighbors and share information and report incidents to the CPD's non-emergency number. Emergencies should be reported to 911. "Trade phone numbers with your neighbors and look out for each other," he said.

Suspected gun shots can be reported to 911. "If you call in gunshots, we will probably drive through the area," he said. "If you identify a specific location, we can get out and look for shell casings."

He recommended that residents report suspicious behavior on their streets.

"If you don't call, we don't know about it," he said. "If you see a suspicious person, get the best description that you can, the location and the time, and call it in." We are still short-staffed, but we will check it out if we can." Non-emergency issues should be reported to 614-645-4545.

Officer Yandrich noted that the Columbus Police have resumed towing abandoned vehicles from public streets. Police had suspended towing because the city's impound lot was at capacity for much of the past year. Police can ticket vehicles if they are not moved after 72 hours and tow them after one week if they remain. You can report abandoned vehicles on public streets at the CPD's non-emergency number of 614-645-4545 or at the city's 311 service at 614-645-3111 or www.columbus.gov/311/ We recommend first checking in with your neighbors to verify the vehicles do not belong to them.

The 30-minute Block Watch meetings continue every month at 6 p.m. on the second Tuesday of each month. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend. A code enforcement meeting and the regular FPCA meetings will follow.



The Block Watch program is our community's way to meet monthly to develop relationships with the Columbus Police Dept. and Franklin County Sherriff's Office, share safety and security concerns, receive updates from law enforcement representatives, and strengthen communication between neighbors to stop crime.



Have you heard the good news?! BLOCK WATCH IS BACK! Block watch will take place the same day as our Forest Park Civic Association meeting and at the same place, Epworth Church, but we are doing things a little differently now. The meeting will begin at 6:00pm and will run until 6:30pm. Officer Yandrich will be present to discuss any of your block watch/security/police-related questions or concerns and Supplemental Security will present any issues during this time. Please note: the majority of the Supplemental Security information will be conveyed during the block watch meeting and NOT during the Forest Park Civic Association Meeting.



If you have questions about a specific matter or case, please email them prior to the meeting so that Officer Yandrich can come prepared. Also, if you have any specific issues or concerns and cannot make the meeting, feel free to email Daryl at <u>dvanmercetta@gmail.com</u> and he will pass them along. We hope to see you there and are counting on your participation to make Block Watch a success. Together we will make a safer and happier neighborhood. After block watch, feel free to stick around for the NCC report at 6:30pm and then the Civic Association at our regular time at 7:00pm.

The Kia Boys are still actively stealing vehicles and there have been reports of violence against police officers when approached. The police force is currently understaffed but they are starting Bike Patrol. While limited, there will be extra officers in the parks on the weekends. Beginning June 19, 2023, the City will start towing vehicles again but the officers will actually have to observe the vehicle not move during a 72 hour period prior to towing. To report an abandoned vehicle, or any other code infraction, contact 311. There have been recent complaints about speeding in the neighborhood but in order for the police to do anything about it, they will need as much information as possible, including any patterns and vehicle details.
