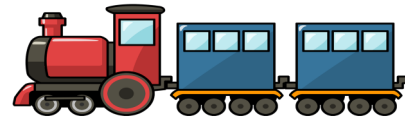

Hello Forest Park! Did anyone else hear gun shots? When you hear something that sounds like gunfire, posting the report to social media trying to obtain confirmation only delays the police's response time. Instead, you should call 911 if it's an emergency or contact the non-emergency police phone number at 614-645-4545 if you're not sure if what you heard was actually gunfire. Be sure to provide as many details as possible, such as time, location, number of shots fired, etc. when contacting the police. The more information available, the better. Only after you report it to authorities should you share the information on social media so others know that it's already been reported and have (hopefully) already reported it themselves. You can also utilize certain apps, such as the Citizen app, to search for reports in the area.



The Kia Boyz are seemingly still active in the area and are still stealing Kias to take out on joyrides. If you own a Kia, it may be advisable to park your car in the garage or use an anti-theft deterrent, such as a Club to protect your vehicle. Now is also a good time to remind you to keep your car doors locked when leaving your car unattended, even in your driveway, and to not leave any valuables in your car. Thieves tend to go after easy targets, such as unlocked cars, and we want to send a message that Forest Park is not an easy target.

The City has advised that they are now towing vehicles again. If you see a code violation, such as a broken down vehicle parked on the street, semis parked in the circle, etc., they can be reported to 311 and will be investigated. The tow lots were previously full but have enough room to resume towing instead of just ticketing.



Don't forget, if you're planning a trip as summer winds down and you're a paid member of the Forest Park Civic Association (only \$30 for the entire year for the entire household!), Supplemental Security is included in your membership. ## The Autumn Challenge

Someone once asked me – what is the difference between “Autumn” and “Fall”. Meteorologically, nothing. They are terms that can be used interchangeably. “Autumn” appears to have been the word of choice historically, for the British, whereas “Fall” appears to be the American counterpart.

I prefer the term “Autumn” which is more romantic and conjures up images of Buffalo Plaid Flannel Shirts, Golden and Rust toned mums, Hot Tea in a mug where you can see the steam wafting up into the air, and the buzzing of bees on my *Autumn Joy* Sedum. “Fall” to me means, quite frankly, leaves on the ground... grab a rake.



Whichever term you prefer to use to describe the time between Summer and Winter, it is a time to be enjoyed and savored. The air becomes a little crisper, the late fruits of the pumpkins, squash, and apples begin to ripen, and the garden begins to transform.

While our annuals are putting forth their last blooms before their demise, our trees and ornamental shrubs are coming into their own. One of the things I’ve noticed, is how much I have depended upon my shrubs to add color to the garden, when the flowers have done their thing.

As the chlorophyll declines in the leaves, the woody shrubs and trees show their true colors. Trees mainly do this after our cold snap in October, but watch your Spirea, Barberry, Aronia (Chokeberry), and even Azalea’s leaves turn from green to red, orange, and a deep yellow.

Autumn is a great time to plant new shrubs and perennials. Growers have made some great strides in creating plants with lovely late foliage colors. While I tend to stay with Native Plants where I can, I absolutely love the ruby and russet colors of my Japanese Maples. Make sure you give them at least 6 weeks to establish before the first hard freeze. September is the month to water, water, water your trees and shrubs, especially the evergreens.

If you are planting bulbs that bloom in the spring, starting in late September, stagger your plantings of bulbs to ensure that you have ongoing blooms in the Spring. Some bulbs naturally bloom early, mid, and late spring, so again **READ YOUR LABELS**.

Inspect your perennials and see if there are any that need to be divided (and shared!)

Speaking of Sharing – the ad hoc Forest Park Garden Club has been busy. They have an informal agenda that allows members to meet on the fly – sometimes simply walking in the metro parks, or visiting gardens that were featured in *Westerflora*. If you are interested in joining a very informal group of people who share your interest. Let us know – send me an email and I’ll get you added to the growing list.


Enjoy the last bits of Summer, as the garden transitions, and the birds begin to prepare for migration.



When neighborhoods are slow to react to graffiti, they give a green light that their neighborhood is an open canvas.

When graffiti is on private property, the cleanup is unfortunately the responsibility of the owner. However, when it is on public property, it's the responsibility of the city. Columbus is very good about responding to graffiti but it has to know about it. That is where we come in.



Please go to [new.columbus.gov](http://new.columbus.gov) (this is the new address for the traditional Columbus 311). Report any graffiti asap. When you have an account, this process is lightning quick. Don't worry if others have reported it already, add your report and make it more visible on the city's "to-do" list. Get into the habit of reporting anything you see

throughout Northland. Make it a game and see how many reports you can file in a year!!

I live in Forest Park West and the most vandalized area is the foot bridge and ramps that go over I-71 just west of Woodward Park. We need diligence there, as well as other areas in our neighborhood.

Now consider the impact of a quick paint-cleansing in the eyes of a vandal. The person just wasted money on spray paint for no effect. The vandal might try again, thinking that the cleaning might have been part of a city maintenance project. But what would the vandal be thinking if its work got scrubbed a second time? Frustration!!! At that point, the vandal will likely go to another location where the paint will be tolerated.

There's probably 25 vandals who try something in our neighborhood over the course of a year. There's over 6,000 of us. Let's be relentless on the reporting and enjoy spoiling a vandal's day. Columbus 311 – [www.new.columbus.gov](http://www.new.columbus.gov).
