

NCC Notes April 1st Meeting

- 1. First, NCC is still without a president. The Vice President is currently running the meetings.
- 2. CPD: The police have been stretched a bit due to protests at the Easton Tesla dealer includ-

- ing counter protests. There have been four robberies at the Sheetz on 161—mostly from people who left their car running. For National Night Out, there will be local sign-up sheets in mid-April. Sign ups on the national website do NOT go to CPD. Homicides are down—none this year as of April 1 in our district.
- 3. They are working on homeless camps in the area, excepting the one along the off ramp from northbound I-71 to 161, as that is ODOT's responsibility.
- 4. Our city attorney's office is working on issues as they come up. FACT and Consider biking reminded us of issues with invasive plants, especially honeysuckle and Bradford pears (there was a recent Dispatch article about the latter). April is Earth Month and May is Bike month.
- 5. Karl Rd Library reminded us that they have regular programming for financial advice, Goodwill technical and career development, James Center cancer information, and an ASL study time. They also have a number of "Culture Passes" for events and museums around the city. See their website for more information. The Rock and Roll exhibits at the Main branch will continue until mid-May. They include free pinball!
- 6. NABA highlights included a nod to the recent quarterly lunch that went well, and a note that the 161 Cleanup Days will start soon. There will be a Tech Recycle April 12 at 4538 Indianola. Our city liaison, Devin Deal noted that there will be a training session for folks to be community advocates on the new 10 year Parks and Recreation plan on April 29. He can be reached at DDDeal@Columbus.gov.
- 7. The April roundtable was a lively discussion about expanding the border of the Northland Community Council to include areas north of Central College Rd, west of Hoover Reservoir. A committee has been formed to study this.
- 8. Dues will be the same for this year as last year. The Parade Committee will be setting up zoom meetings shortly (see the website www.northlandparade.org for more info) to plan the parade. 2025 Parade Theme: 249 and Counting!
- 9. We also had visits from the North Branch of the Y, who will be giving regular updates, the Woodward Park Rec Center Manager (who spoke last month at FPCA), and our State Representative Munira Abdullahi Tel: (614) 500-0103. Email: munirayasin13@gmail.com
- 10. A final note, the NCC Banquet has been postponed to a later date due to planning issues.

May 2025 Garden Corner

The Breakdown on Commercial Synthetic Fertilizers

In the early spring, you can't walk into any garden store without seeing stacks and stacks of bags of fertilizer for your yard and your garden. Is it necessary? How can we use it? How can we use it responsibly? It would be easy to go down a deep rabbit hole here but let's start with some simple biology and chemistry.



We all know that plants need water, light, oxygen, carbon dioxide, but here are the essential nutrients in the soil, that will help new plants grow.

Nitrogen (N) – leaf and stem growth, chlorophyll production, and plant strength

Phosphorus (P) – root development, flowers, fruit set Potassium (K) – water regulation, disease resistance

Calcium (Ca) – structure and development – strong stems!

Magnesium (Mg) – effective photosynthesis (cholorphyll changing water/sun to energy)

Sulfur (S) – plant growth and seed formation

The first 3 elements are found displayed on fertilizer bags that we see and their ratio is designated in a standard format: **N-P-K.** The numbers represent the percentage by weight of each of these three elements that are in the fertilizer formula.

If you want to green up your lawn, you use a formula that is heavier in nitrogen (ex: 20-10-10). For your returning strawberries and blueberries, you would look for a fertilizer that is heavier in Phosphorus (ex: 10-20-10) to promote flower/fruit production.

You also have the option to use a balanced fertilizer (12-12-12) which provides a gentle boost in your emerging plants but doesn't overstimulate growth. This is my "go to" for my spring garden.

Granular or liquid? What form is best?

It's not a question of best, but more efficient. Liquid fertilizer, when applied properly, can give a jump start because it is absorbed faster. Granular, takes a little longer because it needs to dissolve for the plants to utilize it. However, it is more cost effective, and is harder to store, if you don't use it all up when it is applied. Whichever form you use, remember to keep the fertilizer down toward the plant roots, because that is where it will do the most good.

Be Responsible! Commercial manufacturers create products that combine fertilizer with other elements (such as herbicides and insecticides). Scott's Lawn Care 4 step program or Miracle-Gro Potting Soil are examples of this type of product. PLEASE READ YOUR LABELS! Make sure that you apply the correct product for your needs. DON'T OVER PURCHASE. Make you know your square footage of what you need. That way you don't over fertilize your yard (avoiding excess runoff into our watershed), and you won't have to store it!

I do need to mention that there are Organic Fertilizers which are commercially prepared and available for use. I use a mix of organic and synthetic fertilizers for different applications.

The difference between synthetic and organic fertilizers is *the source* of the nutrients in the mix. The ratio and function of the nutrients do not change.
