As a licensed independent social worker, I am committed to ongoing professional development through continuing education classes. Attending healthcare conferences is one meaningful way to fulfill this requirement. Alejandro Varela served as the keynote speaker at the 2024 Equitas Health Institute Transforming Care conference.

He spoke about the importance of advocating for one another and being supportive allies, even when we may not share the same experiences. It can be incredibly impactful when young people advocate for the dignity and respect of older generations. This principle also applies to supporting the LGBTQ+ community.

Taken from the National Association of Social Workers website: "People who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and/or gender expansive, queer and/or questioning, intersex, asexual, and two-spirit (LGBTQIA2S+) are members of every community, and contribute significantly to society every day."

While June's visibility efforts are appreciated and certainly better than nothing, there is a lot of frustration with "rainbow capitalism", the disingenuous effort to tap into the purchasing power of LGBTQ+ consumers.

Here's how to show support all year round:

- -Educate vourself on relevant issues and share this knowledge with others. Learn about the importance of using correct gender pronouns (such as she/her, he/him, they/them) and consider adding your pronouns to your email signature or when you introduce yourself.
- -It's worth noting that many languages and cultures have used gender-neutral pronouns for generations; Examples can be found in historical texts as far back as 1611 and works by Shakespeare.
- -Get involved with local organizations that support the community by volunteering or donating. It is free to spread the word if someone else's work resonates with you.
- -Start conversations that promote understanding and openness—discussing what parts of your identity are important to you can foster connection and empathy. We often have more in common than we realize!

Remember, being an ally isn't just about holding a belief—it's about taking action consistently. It's the thought that counts and a little goes a long way.

Unwelcome Guests: INVASIVE WEEDS – 3 MOST (NOT) WANTED!

By now, your garden has been planted, and you are beginning to enjoy the results of your hard work in April and May.

If you have not already done so, now is the time to get your 1" of mulch down to help cool the roots of your flowering plants and conserve water in the soil. The Farmer's Almanac has predicted a relatively calm summer with average temperatures and rainfall. La Niña, has ended, and it appears that the Pacific Ocean surface temperatures appear to be returning to normal. This affects the jet stream, and is good news for us in Ohio.

While you are out in the garden, you may want to be on the look out for the below listed invasive plants, which are harmful to humans and pets. Be sure to wear protective clothing and dispose of the plant properly. I have added electronic links to the OSU Agriculture data base, for you to visit to see pictures, and more information.

POISON HEMLOCK: https://bygl.osu.edu/node/2111

Poison Hemlock is a deadly plant to both humans and animals. All parts of the plant are toxic: leaves, stems seeds and roots. The plant is spread by seeds in late summer, and now is the best time to look for the young plants in your garden. I have found quite a few this year in my yard, as I am only a few streets away from the 71/161 exchange.

I follow this rule: if it looks like a carrot leaf, and I didn't plant it – it's gone. Removal of the young florets is the only way to slow the spread of this intruder. Be vigilant and be careful. The toxins do not cause a skin irritation or blisters like Poison Ivy.

BITTERSWEET NIGHTSHADE: https://weedguide.cfaes.osu.edu/singlerecord.asp?id=82

This is very common in our area, and are toxic to both humans and animals. However, birds love the berries, so it is easily spread, if not controlled. The sap in this plant can cause a skin reaction similar to poison ivy, but for some people, it can be much worse. Best way to manage this plant is to pull the vines before they flower. If you have shrubs along a fence line, be sure to check around and under the hedge. The key is to pull it before it produces seed. Look for the distinct purple flower. Also, this has a strong smell when it is pulled.

Many of us know the rule: *Leafs are 3, let it be!* The oil from this plant (leaves and stems) cause severe blistering and swelling. If you come in contact with this plant, immediate soap and water will help remove the oil, and all clothes should be washed (separately, not with other laundry). Again, be careful around telephone poles, hedges, and fence lines. It is easy to identify this vine in the fall with its bright red leaves. Gloves and long sleeves while working in these types of areas is recommended.

Obviously there are many more plants that gardeners consider to be weeds. Weeds are simply plants that have chosen to exist where they are not wanted. If you are interested in more information about identified weeds in Ohio, please visit the link: https://weedguide.cfaes.osu.edu

THANKS Forest Park for Recycling, but please NO plastic bags

I've noticed this morning in Forest Park that many residents are using the blue recycling containers. That's awesome. But there's one huge problem. I've seen items for recycling being placed in **plastic bags**. Do NOT do this. It can actually result in the entire truckload being rejected and sent to the landfill. Plastic bags are a big issue as they can jam up the sorting machines. So can things like wires, hoses, and clothing.

A detailed list of acceptable items may be found on the city's webpage at https://new.columbus.gov/Services/Trash-Recycling-Bulk-Collection/How-to-Dispose-or-Recycle/How-to-Recycle, but we will give a short listing here. Cardboard and paper (flatten please), plastic bottles, jugs, tubs, and cups (lids accepted, remove straws, glass bottles and jars (all colors accepted, metal cans and cups (remove aerosol tips), and cartons (rinse and remove lids). Don't put dirty cans or other items in—rinse them first. You do not have to separate items, and lids, caps, and labels may be kept on the items. Do NOT put in plastic bags, wrap, or film, do NOT put in other plastics not on the "good" list, and do NOT put in any kind of styrofoam items (like plates). Again, do NOT use plastic bags for your recycling. At our house, we use paper bags (which you can ask for at many groceries when bagging your purchases), which does make it easier to store and to recycle items. Also, do not recycle electronics. There are private recycling places in Franklin County that will take electronics for recycling and sometimes will pay you for them (excepting old tube TVs—which the city will pick up if you use their bulk pickup program).

In Forest Park, our recycling day is Friday, except when there's a holiday that week. In that case it moves to Saturday. Yard waste is collected separately, every other week. See the city's 311 website for more information.

Remember, the top speed in our neighborhood is 35mph in a few places, and less than that in most.
